



12. FIP EUROPEAN POLO CHAMPIONSHIP IN VILLA SESTA

Villa Sesta Polo Club will host the 12th Fip European Polo Championship, in collaboration with the FISE (Italian Equestrian Sports Federation) and FIP (Federation of International Polo) from 20 to 30 of September 2018.

In the heart of Chianti's countryside in Toscany, one can enjoy unique scenery that is seeped in art, history and nature. Villa Sesta is an evocative ancient village. The Villa Sesta Polo Club is the host of the 12th Fip European Polo Championship from 20 to 30 of September 2018. The tournament will host 14 men polo teams and 4 women polo teams from all Europe. Villa Sesta is one of the top polo clubs in Italy. Its facilities include three polo fields built according to international polo regulations (all made of Tifton) and a world-class practice field. The SolLeone field, opened in 2017, is the largest field in Italy, with adjacent private lake for drinks and chill after game.

Grandstands made of travertine marble alongside field No.1 and a covered, well-equipped reception area of over 100 square meters with an elegant mid-field bar render Villa Sesta Polo Club the ideal location to host international polo tournaments. Furthermore, a new bar for the field No.1, the new gym inside the Relais La Martina

and a convention center for 100 people was inaugurated in March 2013. Over 100 hectares of land are reserved as paddock space for the horses during winter. Villa Sesta offers 180 stalls during the sporting season, with an additinal area for 230 mobile stalls, and 80 during winter. The Argentinean Alejandro Battro, number one in the world in the creation and maintenance of polo fields (including the Palermo Stadium in Buenos Aires, Argentina, known as the "Cathedral of Polo"), is personally responsible for the grounds at Villa Sesta. The club also offers:

- ullet 3 sand riding arenas for training and galloping School horses
- Lodgings for professional players and their grooms
- Proshop with accessories, equipment etc.
- 24-hour guaranteed veterinary service (the club is also located a short distance from an important veterinary clinic)

In one of the most exciting finishes in club history, Team Palm Beach Illustrated won the coveted \$100,000 World Cup presented by Audi at Grand Champions Polo Club. The defending champion and underdog going into the championship final won its' second consecutive title with a thrilling 10-9 victory over Grand Champions in front of a packed house and ESPN Latin American television worldwide audience.

The tournament was resurrected by Grand Champions owners and polo players Melissa and Marc Ganzi thanks to the generosity of Glenn Straub of Palm Beach Polo, where it was last played in the late 1990s. Straub watched the final and participated in the postgame awards presentation.

What made this tournament so unique was the fact it was open to teams 0-26 goal on handicap including an all-women's team for the first time, similar to the Copa Republica in Argentina where teams of any handicap from 0-to-40 can compete. In addition to ESPN's coverage, the tournament was live-streamed by Wellington-based ChukkerTV.

The vibrant season at Grand Champions went on with several exciting tournaments. End of May, the spring season finished with another great news.

Grant Ganzi, Tony Calle and Justin Daniels, representing Grand Champions Polo Club and Lucas Arellano of Everglades Polo Club will represent the United States as newest members of Team USPA. Growing up together, they have played with and against each other in youth and adult tournaments on the polo fields of Wellington. The young players were recently named to the team after a threeday tryout in Aiken, S.C. Team USPA's mission since it was created in 2010 is "to enhance and grow the sport of polo in the U.S. by identifying young, talented American players and providing mentored training and playing opportunities leading to a pool of higher-rated amateur and pro players" while giving back to the sport. Ganzi, 20, a third generation polo player, will be a junior this fall at Lynn University. He has represented the U.S. in two victorious International Cups at Grand Champions and Royal Polo Match in Toronto.



It was not easy to find the right location in a small country full of mountains. He was looking for a flat place, with enough space to have two polo fields, stables, paddocks, and - to make it more complicated - near Zurich. He found it end of 1998, located in the picturesque Zürcher Weinland of Winterthur-Ohringen, so to speak at the foot of the metropolis of Zurich, and after checking with Francisco Podestá, he immediately decided that the place was all that he was looking for, and even more. He was totally right. And with the support of his wife Irene, they started this club. The first year, the club had to stay in a "provisional" stable and to play in a "provisional" polo field until everything was ready. But the spirit, the energy, the support and the trust of the people were always there. We could name many players and fantastic people that were with us during these 20 years, but we want to make a special mention to those that celebrate with us the 20th Anniversary: Family Gräff, Family Podestá, Inge & Rodolfo Binz, Werner Meier, Tutti Wolfensberger, Elfi & Steven Indjic and Dieter Nussbaumer. Thanks for your support and for being part of this amazing club all these years. With the help of farmers of the area: Markus Ackeret and Richard Stucki, PPZ was able to build the first polo field in 1999, our actual Polo Field No. 1 as well as the Stick & Ball field. For the first time, the polosport in the Zurich area got a foothold. And by no means as an elitist game of some super-rich, but as a horse sport discipline which is, for 20 years - at least in PPZ - steadily increasing in popularity.

Since then, Polo Park hosted very important and well know tournaments: Bank Hoffman Polo Open, AAM Swiss Open, ATAG Polo Open, Sarasin Swiss Open, Piaget Polo Open, Swiss Polo Championship, our traditional Zürich Polo Championship, and the popular International Ladies Polo Cup, which is presently in its 19th year. We were fortunate to receive the visit of many High Goal players such as Matias McDonough, Bautista & Marcos Heguy, Martin Garrahan, Javier Novillo Astrada, Hilario Ulloa, Milo Fernandez Araujo, Juan Bollini and many more, without forgetting of course Sunny Hale and Hazel Jackson for the ladies' side.

On the 28th June 2013, Markus Gräff sold the club to Sébastien Le Page, a French national living in Zug, who got, together with his wife Morgan Van Overbroek and their son Armand, the "virus" of this amazing sport, and saw the potential of it as an intense and harmonic family and friends sport. With Sébastien, Polo Park started a new era. A long project and dream became true: Polo Park finally received, after a long wait, the permission to build new infrastructures. With the construction of a clubhouse (with bar/restaurant, terrace, changing rooms, showers, apartments, toilets and parking) to welcome polo players and non-players alike, and 57 new boxes, a horse walker, and the construction of a third field, the club is now implementing the extension of its infrastructure, which had been planned for more than 10 years. This change in philosophy, has led to the modification in name from Polo Park Zürich to Polo Park & Country Club Zürich to better reflect the notion that PPZ is a place for all, players and non-players alike. Polo Park Zürich is today, 20 years later, the biggest club in Switzerland, with more than 60 active members and over 120 VIP members.

MORGAN'S

HOW MANY HORSES DO YOU ACTUALLY HAVE AT THE POLO PARK AND HOW MANY ARE YOURS?

The club hosts about 150 horses. Most of them are members' horses which are placed in the clubstables or at farms next door. Together with my husband, we own 37 of them.

DO YOU REMEMBER YOUR FIRST OWN HORSES? HOW WERE THEIR NAMES. ATTITUDES AND CHARACTERS?

I am a very recent horse owner. Since I was very young, it was my dream to ride horses. I asked my parents for a black stallion to keep in our yard. It never happened. The first horse I rode was at the age of 8 in Tunisia. Her name was Charah and she was an Arabian thouroughbred retired from the races. I was galloping in my second lesson. That day, my dream came true and I discovered the total happiness of being an equestrian. Much later when I was a teenager, I rode a horse named Django. It was in an equestrian club in Belgium and the horse loved to gallop and stop when his nose was touching the wall. Somehow I was the only one staying on him and therefore I became his regular rider. Then I stopped riding for 20 years. My first ever polo pony was Malvada, I still play her once in a while. Then I became a better rider and played higher tournaments and Laucha arrived in my life. She is tiny and has an amazing heart. Whatever the size of the horse next to

her has, if I push her to the riding off, she goes, no fear, no questions, she trusts me.

WHICH IS AT THIS MOMENT YOUR FAVOURITE HORSE AND WHY?

My actual favorite horse is Claro. He arrived in Europe two seasons ago but I didn't play him in the beginning. He was too good and I needed to improve. Now, with him, I feel I can do everything. He feels and thinks faster than me, he knows the game, he knows his job and he's very happy to do it.

WHICH ATTRIBUTES IN THE CHARACTER OF A HORSE DO YOU APPRECIATE MOST?

Patience and trust.

WHAT KIND OF HORSES ARE BEST FOR POLO BEGINNERS? AND WHICH ONES FIT FOR PROFIS?

It all depends on your riding abilities. A beginner player should have a well trained and experienced horse, to take him to the ball and be patient with the rider's mistakes and misses. A good amateur horse has to be faster, experienced but can be young too, and pushing the player to increase his riding abilities. A profi horse will have to perfectly suit his rider. Character, thinking and speed must fit and such a horse needs as well a great heart.





POLO HORSES SEEM TO BE RELAXED MOST OF THE TIME... HOW IMPORTANT ARE GOOD NERVES?

I love those pre-game pictures when you see horses and their grooms waiting for action. The groom is watching the game to ensure to be ready on time and the horse has his eyes half closed. For me, it looks like the horse knows what is coming and just enjoys his peace before going on the field and play. When you change horses or you play, you have to focus on what you do. To have a nervous or jumpy horse will handicap you because you'll need to focus on the horse instead of the game. A horse like that can also injure you or others by kicking or throwing you away. This is why our horses are selected amongst other things for their special character. Very peaceful outside the game and full of power when playing.

SOME PEOPLE SAY A GOOD POLO HORSE CAN "READ" THE GAME. IS THAT TRUE?

Some horses are thinking faster than you, reacting faster than you and in one second you are sitting on the ground next to your horse. So yes, they can read the game, it is part of a good training. Make them understand the game's movements and taking their rider to the ball.

DO YOU THINK THAT HORSES HAVE ANYTHING LIKE "FUN" OR "THE WILL TO WIN" AS DRESSAGE UND JUMPING RIDERS TELL?

This once again, depends on the training of the horse. But for our horses let me say, yes, I want to think that they have fun. I remember stick and balling once next to our club chukkers and my horse always wanted to go to the big field to play with the other ones. She did not want to stay alone with me waiting that I manage to hit the ball correctly.

WHAT IS THE BIGGEST SATISFACTION FOR A POLO HORSE?

Not sure about satisfaction, but joy will be food, for sure. And that perfect moment, after the shower, dried by the sunshine, you bring them to the paddocks and they roll in the dust.

DID YOU EVER EXPERIENCE ANYTHING LIKE JEALOUSY OR ENVY AMONG THE HORSES?

They fight, they communicate, they have their character and likes or dislikes. They have their friends and others they don't like to have too close. You have the bossy horses, the cuddling horses, the lazy ones, the grumpy ones, the always happy ones, the instahorses, the food addicts,... just like us. And when you know your horses, you see much faster when something is wrong.

WHAT ARE YOUR FAVORITE MOMENTS WITH YOUR HORSES?

All moments they don't need to work and I can spend time with them. In the stables when they rest, in the paddocks when they eat or lie down. They are incredibly beautiful animals to watch.

WHAT CHANGES IN YOUR LIFE WHEN YOU OWN A HORSE?

Everything, you need to adapt to that new partnership. And being a rider, sitting on your own horse, your way to look at the world changes. You change perspective, feelings, your way of thinking. For some people it is obvious and fast, for others it takes more time. •





HELINIETS 2018 RULE CHANGE

Since 1 January 2018, the new HPA helmet rules apply. POLO+10 interview with Dr Victor Chua, chairman of the HPA Safety Panel and the HPA Disciplinary Committee, who is himself a surgeon and low-goal player from Cambridge.

FOR MANY YEARS, THE HPA CONSIDERED SAFETY EQUIPMENT AS A MATTER FOR INDIVIDUAL DECISION. WHY DID THEY CHANGE THEIR OPINION?

Polo is probably the only equestrian sport in the UK which does not have detailed rules on protective equipment. In the last five years, we have counted 5 fatalities due to head injuries in the US and UK; the total worldwide is greater. Polo players are busy and most do not prioritise reading up on safety standards, so an element of compulsion is necessary. Look at what the FIA has achieved by implementing rigid safety rules to the number of deaths in Formula 1 in the last 30 years, for example.

WHAT IS THE NEW RULE EXACTLY ABOUT?

From 1st January 2018, helmets have to adhere to one of the following standards, or successor standards. PAS015:2011, SNELL E2001, VG1 01.040 2014-12, UTAC/CRITT 04/2015. We are using the same standards as used by the British Horseracing Authority (BHA) and Irish Turf Club after extensive consultation with them.

HOW CAN I CHECK IF MY HEI MET FITS TO THE NEW BUILE?

The helmet should be marked with one of the above standards. The HPA is aware of the following helmets which meet the standards, you see in the chart below.

THE HPA ANNOUNCED THE RULE IN MARCH 2016 – OVER TWO YEARS AGO. DO YOU THINK THAT ALL INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AND CLUBS ARE WELL INFORMED TODAY?

UK players are pretty well informed. However, I think that players outside the UK are generally not very well informed about the 'helmet rule'. The HPA also requires clubs to appoint a Club Safety Officer, whose role is to promote and oversee safety within the club. We encourage our overseas affiliate clubs to appoint Safety Officers.

WHAT'S NEW IN HELMET TECHNOLOGY?

The new rules have encouraged the development of two quite distinctive technologies. The ARMIS polo helmet has a system which protects against glancing impacts. The Instinct polo helmet uses an aluminium honeycomb to absorb impacts rather than expanded polystyrene.

DO ALL MANUFACTURERS PROVIDE HELMETS ACCORDING TO THE NEW GUIDELINES?

I believe that La Martina, Casablanca, and Falcon are all in the process of producing helmets which are compliant with the new guidelines, but they have not sent me their final test certificates. It will be good to have their participation.

These are the certified helmets, marketed for polo, that we are aware of. Certified helmets for general equestrian use are also acceptable.




WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN TYPE APPROVAL AND QC? WHAT ABOUT THE KITEMARK? WHAT ABOUT CE MARKS?

A CE mark means that the helmet meets the EU requirements for "Personal Protective Equipment", and is required for retail sale of helmets in the EU.

A CE mark is obtained by "type approval" which means that helmets are submitted to an EU registered testing organisation and these helmets are tested. The manufacturer self-certifies that the helmets for sale are of the same type and standard as those tested.

A QC mark goes further and typically requires regular testing and a factory audit. The BSI Kitemark is a type of QC Mark, but there are others QC marks promoted by other testing laboratories, eg. SEI,





IC, Snell. Regular independent testing will give the user the greatest confidence that the helmet purchased is of satisfactory quality.

TO WHOM CONCERN THE NEW HELMET RULES? EVERY PLAYER ALL OVER THE WORLD?

Broadly speaking, the HPA's rules cover players who are not in the USA or Argentina. But players in the US and Argentina should be aware that safety rules are coming. We have been discussing with both the USPA and the AAP safety committees. The USPA is bringing in their own helmet rule from June 2020. Their standard is based on the NOCSAE standard, which is a stricter standard than the European standards, and results in a heavier helmet. NOCSAE is based on American football and the European standards are based on horse-racing. The AAP safety committee is six

months old and has yet to issue standards, but we have shared our data with them and will support them as they decide what to do. For us the important things are: three-point harness, to avoid helmets falling off on impact, and appropriate shock-absorbing material to reduce the g-forces on the head to below 250g.

WHICH ARE HPA-AFFILIATED INTERNATIONAL POLO ASSOCIATIONS?

Australia, Austria, Barbados, Brunei, China, Denmark, France, Germany, Ghana, Greece, India, Jamaica, Kenya, Malaysia, New Zealand, Nigeria, Pakistan, Czech, Singapore, South Africa, Sweden, Switzerland, Thailand, Turkey, Zambia, Zimbabwe

HOW LONG DOES A HELMET NORMALLY STAY ALIVE AND FUNCTIONAL, WHEN SHOULD I CHANGE IT?

Helmets should be changed every four years or after a major impact, which deforms the shock-absorbing material.

WHICH PRODUCT AND MANUFACTURER DO YOU PREFER PERSONALLY?

I have personally purchased helmets from almost every manufacturer, as I am very interested in safety and I wish to see the advances for myself before writing about them. I like them all, they are all major advances on the traditional two-point harness model.


The East End of London referred as the 'East End', where the 'Cockney' lived, often thought of as a 'rough and ready' part of London, Bryan Morrison came from the East End, yet was no such man. I never met Bryan however, with my research I confess I would have wanted to meet him. His view on life, his goals, family and passions defined Bryan to be a great guy. Bryan's fortune was made in the music industry, which included Wham, the Bee Gees and my all time favourite band, Pink Floyd. All known globally, all big or even massive names and would completed a mans life to have achieved such. However, Bryan Morrison had so much to give us he was certainly not just another brick in the wall but was a crazy diamond. The Daily Telegraph wrote "Morrison liked to cultivate the air of a cigar-chomping, East End hustler; but he was a self-made man of great flair and unfailing instinct. Physically large and robust, he displayed charisma and self-confidence which led some to accuse him of arrogance." The Royal County of Berkshire Polo Club known as the 'Berkshire', founded in

1985 from which was once the site of the Windsor Forest Stud which housed horses for Royal Ascot. Jamie Morrison spotted it while in the back of his dad's car, although the area was a run down area, Bryan bought it and vowed to make it into a premier polo club for all who wanted to play polo where ever they came from as well for Bryan himself. Jamie Morrison said, "Dad wanted it to be a club where anyone could come and learn to play this incredible game that he had become addicted to, no matter their colour or creed." Morrison and Lobel, who was Bryan partner did not have it easy either, with planning permissions issues, rain that washed away the seeding on a newly prepared grounds. In 1986 only a year later the club opened with its first member Prince Charles, since that day the club has continued the ethos that polo is for those who love it and want to play. The jewel in the "Berkshire's" crown, held under the patronage of H.R.H. Prince of Wales. The Prince of Wales, a tournament first played in 1986 continues to be one of the four major championships in the English polo season.

He became a gentleman in Polo, and his name will continue to live on.

Winning Team Cartier 2018. All that remains to be said, is, we can't wait for the Snow Polo World Cup St. Moritz 2019, on 25, 26 & 27 January 2019!

From the very first moment the ball ws in play, the Cartier goalscoring machines Dario Musso, Chris Hyde, Rommy Gianni and new Cartier teammate Juan Cruz Greguoli were on fire. As the teams thundered around the frozen lake in the first chukker, the boys in blue, Maserati, stuck to their 'Red Devil' adversaries like glue, desperately trying to keep the goal-scoring firepower at bay. Greguoli was the first to convert his continued efforts on goal, an excellent example of the ease with which these high goal players convert their grass polo expertise to snow. Not only that the crowd expected the "classic" final of the Argentine Open – Ellerstina vs La Dolfina – but also the inauguration and final of the ever first Argentine Women's Polo Open at the "Cathedral of Polo" in Palermo/Buenos Aires.

La Dolfina Brava with Mía Cambiaso 5, Milagros Fernández Araujo 6, Nina Clarkin 10 and Candelaria Fernández Araujo 6 was the winner of the 1st Argentine Open Women's Polo Championship.

The very first edition of the Ladies Argentine Open Championship was held at the Alfredo Lalor de Pilar headquarters of the Argentine Polo Association from Tuesday 21 November until 2 December. The Women's Final took place on 2 December before the grand final of the men at the Argentine Polo Field in Palermo. 6 women's teams with up to 30 goals teamhandicap and players from Argentina, Germany, USA, France and England took part. The Board of Directors of the Argentine Polo Association – since 1 May 31 led by Eduardo Novillo Astrada – had launched the new Argentine Open Championship of Women's Polo as one of the first official acts. Now the first edition of this new tournament set an exciting milestone in the history of Ladies Polo.

La Dolfina Brava with Mía Cambiaso 5, Milagros Fernández Araujo 6, Nina Clarkin 10 and Candelaria Fernández Araujo 6 was the winner of the 1st Argentine Open Women's Polo Championship. The final against Ellerstina featuring Clara Cassino 6, Hazel Jackson-Gaona 8, Lía Salvo 9 and Sarah Wiseman 7 was held right before the decisive men's match at the the Argentine Polo Field in Palermo. In a very good match in which the two unbeaten teams faced each other, La Dolfina Brava won the title after beating Ellerstina 7:6 in a supplementary chukker thanks to Nina Clarkin's golden goal after converting a penalty kick from the 30 yards. After the first chukker has offered various options for both teams, the second round was the opposite: tangled, locked and very fought, no goals. From there, La Dolfina Brava began to handle the actions and took the lead with 6:3. But in the last chukker, Lía Salvo realised the unthinkable and scored 3 goals in a row which took the match to supplementary. There, after two chances squandered by sisters Cande and Mila Fernandez Araujo, Nina Clarkin took advantage of a foul and saved the title for her team by scoring to 7:6 from 30 yards. The major trophy was awarded to the captain of La Dolfina Brava, Mía Cambiaso, by the president and CEO of

Newsan Group (ATMA), Luis Galli. Most Valuable Player of the 1st Argentine Open Women's Polo Championship became Candelaria Fernández Araujo while Lía Salvo was the tournament's leading scorer with 23 goals. Congratulations, La Dolfina Brava!

The legendary final of the best and most important polo tournaments in the world featured again the traditional encounters La Dolfina and Ellerstina. Ellerstina started the firstchukker with a lead of 3:1. But La Dolfina came back in the second chukker with goals from Cambiaso, MacDonough and Pieres – score 4:3. After an evenly balanced and thrilling match until the fifth chukker, which ended equally at 8 a piece, Juan Ma and Pablo put the heat on during the 6th chukker, not letting anyone through their La Dolfina defence. By the beginning of the 8th and supposedly final chukker, Ellerstina was behind by 4 goals. But the Pieres brothers Polito and Facu scored and converted two further penalties into goals, the final one with only 30 seconds on the clock. The audience went wild! So, the encounter went into overtime at a 13:13 score in the 8th chukker. La Dolfina took advantage of an air shot by Polito Pieres to regain possession and Adolfo Cambiaso launched a long pass to Juan Martín Nero who scored the winning goal taking La Dolfina to a 14:13 win, their fourth consecutive win against Ellerstina and fifth win in a row at the Argentine Open.

La Dolfina won its 11th title in Palermo in its final No. 17 (13 consecutive) since the club was created in 2000 (only in 2004 La Dolfina did not reach the decisive match). Adolfo Cambiaso, who played his 100th match at the Cathedral of Polo in Palermo during the 124. Argentine Open, achieved his 14th title. Juan M. Nero and Pablo Mac Donough won their Palermo Open No. 8, while David Stirling was awarded his 6th title in history.

Argentina is the winner of the XI FIP World Polo Championship in Sydney 2017.

After over a year of preparation, the Sydney Polo Club welcomed the international polo community for the XI FIP World Polo Championship Sydney 2017 from October 21-29. Established in 1987, the FIP World Polo Championship takes place once every three years in a different country around the world. In Sydney, Argentina won their third FIP World Championship with an overtime goal by Lucio Fernandez Ocampo in dramatic scenes. Argentina had the upper hand in the first half that saw the Chileans blunt the Argentine attack with relentless man marking. Time and time again Argentina tried to free up the play but saw multiple attempted passes blocked. If Argentina looked in more control in the first half, it was Andres Vidal who was the rock for Chile. He gained control of the game in the second half. While Argentina won far more first phase possession, winning 15 throw ins to six from Chile, it was Chile in the second half who managed to find runners and gain the ascendency. As commentator Glen Gilmore said during the game, "both teams protect the man with the ball so well." In doing so, the game remained tense rather than free flowing."

The build up to the dramatic final started in the fourth chukker. In a nail biting last regular chukker, the Chilean defenders left the ball, terrified of committing a foul. Hector Guerrero picked up the ball and advanced up field. With 10 seconds remaining he was pushed off the play but his teammate Lucio Fernandez Ocampo was first to pick up the ball behind him, hammering a shot through the posts. Now the game was tied for Argentina with one second remaining in the final chukker. And it was again Ocampo, who scored the golden goal for Argentina in overtime.

As well in an overtime and thrilling chukker England beat USA to claim the bronze medal of the 11th FIP Word Championship at Sydney Polo Club. The game had looked comfortable for England until the fourth chukka, winning almost double the throwins and benefitting from USA missing open chances to score from close range and a crucial 40-yard penalty at the start of the fourth chukker. With four professional players on each team, both teams looked to counter and use all their men at the first opportunity. Into the extra chukka the game went. USA fired from distance, as they had regularly all game, but the ball crept left of the post. Finally England claimed the bronze medal by scoring the golden goal to a 5:4 victory. "Great to win third but that wasn't the objective," said England's captain Dhillon, who again referred back to the game against New Zealand which they lost to hand Chile the advantage in Zone B.

Compliments on the horses were today taken a new level as players say they are considering buying some of the horses being lent to them. Whether that is just apres-game talk or not, what higher compliment could there be to the tournament and to those Australians who have lent their horses?

Caset and Du Plessis teamed up with Pedrinho Zacharias and Willian Rodrigues, both local 7-goal players, to challenge Facundo Sola and Pelon Stirling, who played along-side Joao Paulo Ganon and Olavo Novaes (also 7-goals). Action continued on Sunday with two matches, where the high goalers shared the field with Brazilians enthusiastic to play with APPL rules. The last time an outstanding Argentine player travelled to Brazil to play was in the year 2000, when the Heguys visited. So an appearance from 10-goal superstar Sapo Caset was very well received. "This was my first time in Brazil and it was a lot of fun," shares Caset. "The people are very considerate and kind. I was pleasantly surprised by the level of polo there, by the club, the fields, the private grounds, everything was first class. The APPL matches were competitive, and there were several Brazilians who play well and have a lot of potential."

"Playing the APPL is always good fun, and we are working to further polish the rules," continues Caset. "In fact, after discussing it with Javier Tanoira, we tweaked a rule before the games on Sunday. It is always positive to continue innovating and improving. I think Javier's concept of an APPL World Tour is great. So far this year I have played the APPL in the US, now in Brazil, and we hope to be able to organise an exhibition in Russia during the football World Cup. It's also likely that we will do something in England. I support the APPL and I'm happy to be a part of the project." Javier Tanoira, founder of the All Pro Polo League, is adamant that the level of polo can only grow on a global scale if players from diverse nationalities improve. He holds that this can only happen if these up-and-coming players can learn from the best in the world. Tanoira believes that Brazil has potential to become one of the central destinations of the international polo circuit. "Brazil has a very prominent polo culture," he explains. "Those who play have a higher than average level of polo than in other countries, so there are not necessarily many patrons. In most places, the only way to create good polo is by hiring foreigners, but the Brazilians can play good polo among themselves. Brazil is going to be a set fixture in the APPL World Tour. We are working together with the locals and we are very in sync with everyone there."

Brazilian Pedrinho Zacharias was much inspired by the concept behind the league. "I loved playing the APPL," he shares. "The game really changes with the new rules, it is a lot faster and more dynamic. Players nowadays change very frequently and I am not sure if today's horses can handle playing five minutes non stop, but we have to change that mentality and learn how to manage the horses. Playing with Pelon, Sapo, and Facu was an amazing experience." The next stop on the All Pro Polo League WORLD TOUR: France!



FOUNDER OF THE ALL PRO POLO LEAGUE (APPL)

WHAT IS THE GENERAL IDEA OF THE ALL PRO POLO LEAGUE?

The APPL works to encourage dynamic, open polo and motivate a professional attitude towards the sport. Fundamentally, the league hopes to make polo a more straightforward, enjoyable spectator sport, by enhancing the qualities that make the game so thrilling. This is done through a new set of rules, which have been put in place to simplify the game, not only for spectators, but for players and umpires as well.

YOU HAVE BEEN YOURSELF A 7-GOAL POLO PRO. WHEN AND WHY DID YOU COME TO THE POINT WHERE YOU DECIDED TO MAKE POLO SIMPLER. MORE DYNAMIC, MORE OPEN AND MORE ENJOYABLE FOR THE VISITORS?

I retired from polo when I was still young, at thirty-two, because what I was playing was not exciting anymore. The speed of the game had decreased and that was a big turn off. My generation was the last to be taught that if you hit the ball and went flat out you would win. I fell out of love with polo in 2002 when I saw it start to deteriorate, and from that moment it has continued to slide downhill. In 2009, I wrote an essay entitled "A Reflection on Argentine Polo" commenting on the

problems the sport was facing. It's quite simple, actually: If the players on the field are having a good time, then so will the spectators. For that to happen polo needs to regain the speed and rhythm it once had. In 2015, I decided to put my words into action and I founded the All Pro Polo League.

THEREFORE YOU DEFINED NEW RULES, WHAT ARE THEY ABOUT IN PARTICULAR?

The rules are designed to make the game faster and simpler to understand. I can tell that the players really like this kind of game. They have to think faster and it helps them improve. We generally talk about speed but what we are trying to achieve is rhythm of play; rhythm is what makes the game entertaining. The key to good polo is maintaining the speed throughout the whole chukka, and APPL rules are designed to promote this. In most high-goal or patron-based polo you get a couple of chukkas that are fast, but then there is a foul, play stops, and you have a period of time where play is very tangled, players are shouting and sticking their mallets up. That is what we are trying to avoid.



But the most significant rule imposed by the APPL is the limitation of one horse per chukka. There are two fundamental reasons why we believe this rule is beneficial for polo. The first is simply common sense, considering that twenty years ago, when polo was more fluid than it is today, only one horse was played per chukka. Consider that good mares used to play two whole chukkas in the Argentine high goal. Horses did not tire because polo was a team sport; the problem is that polo today is centred on the individual. Horses do not tire from running; what exhausts them is the constant stopping, starting and crashing that is so common in polo nowadays. By limiting the number of horses allowed per chukka, we intend to force players to play polo as it was originally. Our aim is to create a more attractive spectacle for everyone involved, beyond winning or losing. The other reason has to do with self-limitation.

Every season more people, namely patrons, distance themselves from the polo world because they cannot compete with the big organisations with unlimited budgets and players who use twelve or fourteen horses per game. By limiting the number of horses to be played per chukka, thus allowing only six horses per match, we are rewarding the players who focus their efforts on riding well and training their horses correctly, those who administer the energy of their horses, and overall, we are rewarding the best horses. We believe that this rule will revolutionise the sport of polo, making it more accessible to a wider audience. This type of limitation has already been enforced in other sports motor racing limited the number of cars a team could use during a championship—and has seen positive results. In these first editions of the APPL, we have reduced the length of a chukka from seven minutes down to five. Players will be able to adjust to the rules and have time to prepare their horses for the challenge, but we hope to play seven minute chukkas with one horse in future editions.

THE APPL IS WORKING ON A NEW DEFINITION AND UNDERSTANDING OF POLO IN THE FUTURE. WHAT ARE YOUR NEXT STEPS IN THIS DIRECTION?

It is not so much a new definition, but more a way of recovering the sporting values that have been lost. We must remember that polo is the oldest team sport in existence, dating back thousands of years. A boring sport doesn't survive that long. Polo was once a spectacular sporting event, but over the years it has transformed into something terrible to play and watch. This happened because everyone, and I include myself, let the sport be governed by self interest. The players changed the game to benefit themselves, as did those in leading positions, and the polo world failed to control this behaviour. We need to look at what made polo such an attractive sport originally and work to merge those principals with the increased skill and growth in technology there is today.

YOU ALREADY HAVE A BROAD SUPPORT FROM THE IMPORTANT POLO ASSOCIATIONS. WHAT IS THEIR COMMENT ON THE APPL AIMS?

They all support the APPL and are in favour of what we are trying to promote. We need them to be more proactive, however. Our aim is to unite every Association and let them be the owners of the League, that way they will do everything possible to grow the APPL. We want to League to revolutionise the sport and benefit everyone.

THE NUMBER OF INTERNATIONAL APPL TOURNAMENTS INCREASED SINCE 2015. WHERE ARE YOU HOSTING APPL TOURNAMENTS IN 2018?

This year we are hosting our first APPL World Tour. We started with a tournament in Palm Beach, USA, in March. We now travel to Brazil, then England in June, France in July, Spain in August, and back to Argentina in November.

WHY IS THE IDEA OF A LEAGUE (KIDS AND PROS) IMPORTANT AND WHAT DOES THIS STRUCTURE INTEND?

We believe that Argentina's dominance is a barrier to the development of the sport, and it is time that we, as Argentines, do something about it. That is why we have started to structure our tournaments around 10 goal players and local, up-andcoming youngsters. The only way a polo player of any level can improve is by playing with and against the best players in the world at a level superior to the one they are used to. That is how Argentine players grow, and it is unfair that other nationalities don't have that possibility on a recurring basis. Our current format is unique because it gives American, French, Spanish, English and Brazilian players the chance to learn from the best.

WITH YOUR ESSAY "A REFLECTION ON ARGENTINE POLO" YOU CREATED THE BASIS OF WHAT THE APPL DEALS WITH TODAY, WHAT NEEDS TO BE RENEWED IN POLO IN GENERAL?

Polo was transformed forty years ago when patrons came into the picture. The necessity to fund the sport destabilised the game. Professionals began playing with amateurs and the quality of play decreased enormously. This never happened in any other sport; pros always play with pros, children with players their age, and veterans compete with veterans. When amateurs started becoming an integral part of polo, no one stopped to consider the rules, or if anything in the game needed to be adapted. As a result, polo became slower, more dangerous, and almost political. Towards the end of the 1970s polo reached a breaking point and nobody stepped in. We need to renew the vibrancy of polo of the past by allowing professionals to compete among themselves. We need to recover the fundamentals of polo, and tie them in with the advancements made in skill and technology. •



One day you have to see Palermo, there is Sotogrande, Palm Beach, Dubai and the Queens Cup. But playing chukka's as part of a local polo community in an environment far away from your own is a special sensation of enjoying polo.

Jurassic Park sucks you into the family right from the pick-up at the airport. Grandma Merle waits for us and proves why she is the mother of a poloplayer by driving the mini-van professionally and fast through the beautiful hills of Eastern South Africa. It is not only 5-goaler Selby Williamson as a coach, but the Williamsons have 3 generations ready to make the stay at Jurrasic Park a warm one. Selby's mom and dad drive the vehicles, assist with meals, especially desert, and tell stories at the fire-place with drinks. Selby's partner Jacky is an expert on horses, riding and a strong player. The kids vary in ages in handicaps and join the guests on weekends and holidays. And for doglovers there are 10 more family-members.

When we join the group to go with some Dutch, German and English polofriends there so many questions. Is it safe to go, do I need my sticks, do we do anything else than polo, can I join as a beginner, are stay and food included, are there any zebra's? The answer to all of that was yes, so there we went. All of us arriving from seperate international destinations joing at the local airport of Pietermaritzburg. A little surprised by the feeling of an English atmosphere in a sunny climate and African culture.

We doze off despite of the amazing view of hills and lakes, with little African round huts with thatch roofs. All of a sudden we turn left and arrive at the main house. A herd of dogs greet us like they have known us for ever and we are all divided between romantic little cottages in the garden. Before we have time to think we are on our way to the clubhouse and on the polofield playing chukka's.

The horses in South Africa are based very much on the thoroughbreds of the racetrack which makes them elegant and fast. At Jurassic Park there are around 150 horses and we visit the breeding

mares in the hills around the field. The paddocks are of the size of a nature reserve and hold two groups of zebra's who live happily along the polohorses. For us this is like a mini-safari on the way to the top of the mountain where we have sundowners looking down from high-up to the club and enjoying the sunset.

We play chukka's at the homefield surrounded by the hills and zebra's watching us by sunset. After a rainy day we move to the neighbouring club at Swartberg where the local members of the club join us. All questions that arise about rules are adressed over drinks at the polobar at night. Selby is a great believer of creating a solid technical basis on the wooden horse, and we start every day with the 4 basic shots and little secrets that make us hit further and more accurate.


The seasons in South Africa are reverse from Europe like Argentina which makes October till April the perfect time to travel. Before there were very clear hot or rainy months but this changed as it did all over the world. Generally the temperature is pleasant from 18 degrees up to hot days with 30. But the nights are cold in the hills so every day starts cool again. Even with rain there are several options for fields close-by so very little days are lost. The alternative of swimming with the horses and practising penalties is not that bad either ..

The days pass easy, we cuddle with a baby zebra, talk endlessy about polo, eat too much and more. And we challenge ourselves on the polofield. As these kind of weeks do, time flies and before we know we have to leave our polo paradise and travel back with great memories, some new friends and eager to start our poloseason at home. My advice, keep a good percentage of your polo budget for travelling. Polo in your home country is a great way to relax after the office, to make friends and enjoy the benefit of spending time with horses. Travelling for polo is making it all complete.


BIOGRAPHY

YOU HAVE SAID THAT THE MALTESE CAT IS AUTOBIOGRAPHICAL. Much of it, yes, although the stories are pure fiction.

OK, LET'S START AT THE BEGINNING. A BFA IN MOTION PICTURES FROM UCLA AND A MASTERS IN INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS FROM USC, THEN YOU WORKED ON THE SPACELAB, FOR TWO FINANCIAL NEWSPAPERS, AND YOU WERE A STOCKBROKER AFTERWARD?

DO YOU PLAY POLO?

Recreationally, just like the main character. After playing in Europe and in the USA, I moved to Argentina, where I have lived for the past twelve years. Great opportunity to play polo every day. But any polo player who reads these books will realize right away that the author has an intimate knowledge of the game of polo. That you won't find in other novels.

HOW DID YOU COME UP WITH THE IDEA OF THE MALTESE CAT? WHERE DO YOU GET YOUR IDEAS FROM?

After I moved to Argentina, a lot of my friends were asking me for polo advice. Since many had the same questions, including asking for plans of wooden horses and hitting cages, I created a website so I wouldn't have to repeatedly write the same things or download the same plans. I named the website after Rudyard Kipling's short story, The Maltese Cat. It is a story about a pony in a polo match who helps out his teammates with useful advice. It seemed appropriate for the website. •

Some years ago, POLO+10 introduced the UK based polo commentator, player, coach and La Martina-Ambassador Jan-Erik Franck as the "Voice of Polo" to the international polo community. Today he is commentating the most important tournaments in the world.

THE POLO WORLD KNOWS YOU AS THE "VOICE OF POLO". NOW YOU'VE JUST BEEN TO FLORIDA FOR A COUPLE OF MONTHS WORKING FOR GRAND CHAMPIONS POLO CLUB AND CHUKKERTV. HOW DID IT GO THERE?

America was fascinating. The level of play that I experienced there was phenomenal and it was a great to be invited by Melissa and Marc Ganzi to work and commentate at Grand Champions Polo Club. It was also awesome to commentate together with the great Dale Schwetz at chukkertv. An absolutely incredible and fantastic experience.

HOW WOULD YOU DESCRIBE THE US POLO SEASON IN GENERAL, WHAT IS THE ATMOSPHERE LIKE?

Wellington really is a hub of world top class polo. The best players from all over the world were there. And the atmosphere is – a little bit like here in England – when it comes to purists who really want to watch and experience a good game of polo. That is what the atmosphere is like at Wellington. The real polo fans come here. It is just exceptional polo, and it was fantastic to watch every day.

WHAT ARE THE MOST SIGNIFICANT DIFFERENCES BETWEEN THE US AND THE EUROPEAN POLO SPORT?

America is one of the big three, sitting alongside Argentina and the UK. The sport and the infrastructure is second to none and displays polo at its best. It was a real pleasure working for Grand Champions Polo Club!

IN HOW MANY COUNTRIES HAVE YOU ALREADY COMMENTATED POLO TOURNAMENTS? AND WHICH NEW DESTINATIONS WILL BE ADDED THIS YEAR?

I havn't actually added up all the countries, but I guess a couple of dozens, or so. From America to Azerbaijan, to Switzerland, to Italy, to Croatia. Every year there seems to be a new destination to the tour. This year I will go to Willich in Germany for the first time. It is close to my hometown and I am really very much looking forward to that. Yes, let's see what else the season has to bring.

YOU'RE NOT JUST COMMENTATOR, BUT ALSO COACH AND PLAYER (AS YOU CAN SEE ON THE COVER OF THIS ISSUE) HOW OFTEN DO YOU PLAY?

Yes. I unfortunately cannot play as much as I used to as time does not allow that. I am never really in one place long enough to play a full tournament. The majority of my polo I play in the winter season during February and March when I am in the UK. That is arena polo. So yes, I am not as much in the saddle as I would like to be. But at any chance, I am in the front row to play and to get on a pony.

THERE SEEMS TO BE A DECLINE IN THE GROWTH OF POLO THROUGHOUT EUROPE. WHAT DO YOU THINK IS THE REASON FOR THAT AND WHAT NEEDS TO BE DONE?

As polo is going a bit through a turbulent time at the moment globally, sponsorship is hard to come by. What needs to happen in order to secure the future and growth of polo is investing at grass-root-level. Young players should be promoted and encouraged to come up through the ranks to play polo in the future. There is a lot of uncertainty in the air within the Euro Zone and new destinations beyond Europe are now developping for Europeans to play abroad such as Mallorca and Florida.

WHAT ARE THE THREE BEST TOURNAMENTS IN THE WORLD

Very good questions. It is very difficult to say because there are different levels and different kinds of polo. But as far as the traditional grass polo is concerned the British Open, the Gold Cup, the US Open and of course the Open in Argentina are the most important and best tournaments from a purist point of view at that level. But then of course you have tournaments at different levels, exotic levels and also very very hard competitions. The list of great tournaments goes on and on and would be too long to mention.

AND WHICH TOURNAMENTS WOULD YOU REALLY LIKE TO COMMENTATE AT IN THE FUTURE?

I am fortunate to have commentated at the British Open and I would love to do the US and Argentine Open (if that were even possible ... :) •


