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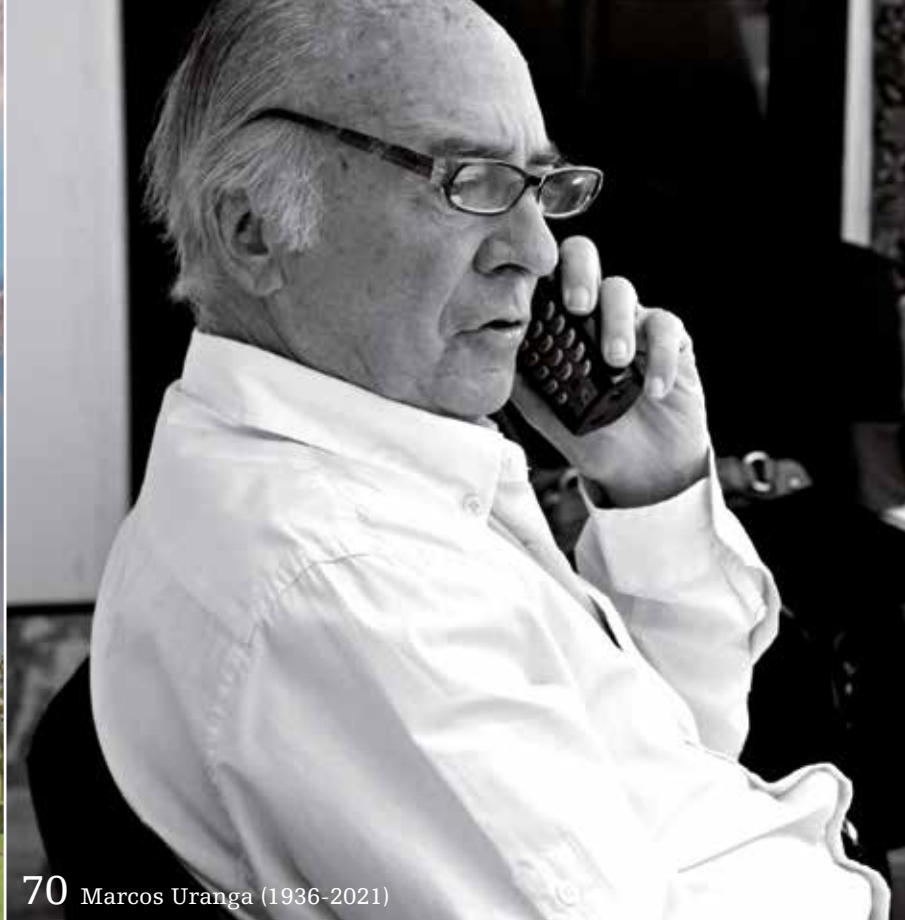

We all started the year with the fear of not being able to play polo. Month after month, the COVID-19 pandemic was slowly progressing from China to Europe and then in the blink of an eye, the entire world was put on pause.

The cases were exploding in Switzerland and we fought it hard to keep our spirits up. But once again, Francisco Podesta's (our polo manager) optimistic predictions were right, and we had an amazing, if unexpected, polo season.

As the Swiss regulations put in place to slow the pandemic down always allowed people to visit their horses, as soon as our horses were back in Zurich, our stables opened for S&B. Bringing the petiseros from Argentina was a real challenge, but they finally made it! By mid-June, we were allowed to play tournaments and we decided to extend the polo season up to mid-October from the usual end-September.

The tournament season was squeezed into three intensive months, with some players from Germany, England, Italy, and Holland coming to compete. The polo fields were greener than ever and in impeccable condition. We had to learn to dance the COVID-19 waltz, closing borders here, opening borders to another country, setting random quarantines,

allowing and restricting the public to events, and so on....

The season was short, intense, condensed. Our players had so much polo to play, that no one had the time to get infected by the virus thus allowing us to play 800 chukkers and 7 tournaments, sometimes with 2 separate leagues. We had the joy to see players coming back after many years and new players coming to discover our facilities. The level of local players increased and many young talents saw their handicap raised by the end of the season. It was also the first time in the history of the club that we reached 200 horses owned by our members. This number will clearly be topped in 2021 with already many horses flying from Argentina to bring new blood in existing organizations or with emerging players.

2020 was a season to care about our members, to show resilience, to do what we do best: play polo as much as we can. It was certainly a challenging season in terms of organization, but in terms of polo, it was a great one!

In 2021, Polo Park & Country Club Zürich will be, amongst other projects, the training center of the Swiss National Polo team to prepare the new generation of polistas for the upcoming European Championships.

A light rainfall on Friday helped prepare the field for the weekend of the Swiss Medium Goal at Polo Park Zurich which took place from August 13-16th – certainly, a highlight in the Swiss Polo Season, with four teams competing for the trophy.

Saturday – We were not disappointed! The first game started with Los Lobos, with our host Sébastien Le Page leading his team consisting of Thommy Gräff, Martin Podesta and Markus Gräff onto the field and setting up a paced attack against Team G-Squared. G-Squared proved to be a match for this and both Eva Brühl and Walter Cortez with competent assistance from teammates Richard Harris and Thomas Wolfensberger had the potential to light up the game with their display of speed and controlled aggression. With the score of 7 : 7 at the end of the 4th chukker, umpires Martin Fewster and Mark Holmes explained we needed a result and that the game would go into extra time. It was Los Lobos who pushed in that golden goal and put themselves into the finals.

Jockeying for their position in Saturday's second game were the teams Equilibrium and Cardo Polo. Equilibrium with our hostess Morgan Van Overbroek, Daniel Aegerter, Joaquin Copello and Milos Ruszkowski, quickly broke through Cardo's defense and put themselves on the score board within the first chukker. It took until the 4th chukker for the momentum to swing in the opposite direction as Cardo, with Ann Meier and Mark Oggenfuss sharing a position, Laurenz Gabrin, Christopher

Kiesel, and Patricio Gaynor, put in 2 quick goals, but time had run out. Equilibrium were able to hold their lead of 4 : 2^{1/2} and secure their place in Sunday's final.

Sunday – A South American flair welcomed the spectators at the hospitality tent with tasty empanadas served by Gaucho González, Marco from Zigarren Kurier with his cigar lounge and Equadorian Panama Hats luring both men and women to peruse under their shade. A touch of Argentinian lifestyle was provided by Nia at Cortez Polo and a soothing summer beat by DJ Zoë.

First up on the field were teams G-Squared vs Cardo. Cardo secured themselves third place with 10^{1/2} : 3.

The final was played between Los Lobos & Equilibrium. Martin Podesta, as always, read the game superbly and consistently getting the call for penalties. For Equilibrium, it was Daniel Aegerter who opened their scoring with his goal in the first chukker and a confident Morgan Van Overbroek converted a penalty in the second chukker to equalize. With just over three minutes to play in the final chukker, the score stood at 4 : 4 with both teams struggling to break through defenses, and the crowd beginning to look forward to extra time. MVP winner Martin Podesta scored two quick goals for Los Lobos. We had the Swiss Medium Goal champions!

A Special Prize-Giving – The teams were lined up in front of Porsche-Winterthur's new additions, the Macan and Taycan. The

table was covered in gifts nestling around the unique Swiss Medium Goal trophy.

Apart from the showering of these gifts on each of the teams and the triumphant lifting of the trophy by the winners, Los Lobos, the prize-giving was the opportunity for Sébastien Le Page to call us all to come together for Basti Fernandez and the charity action set up by Polo Park Zurich. Basti was then asked to draw the winner of the helmet designed and signed by Adolfo Cambiaso, donated by Performance Polo. The lucky man to win this was Tomas Leguizamon who was immediately contacted by phone. Sébastien was pleased to inform me that Tomas has in the meantime re-donated the helmet so that Polo Park Zurich can repeat the charity action next year.

What a privilege to have been a part of this impressive charity and splendid tournament.

ROLLS-ROYCE

MOTOR CARS

YOU KNOW THOSE STORIES ABOUT ROLLS-ROYCE?
THEY ARE ALL TRUE

Upon announcing that Rolls-Royce equips its motor cars with a refrigerator that has two cooling modes: 'Summer' and 'Winter', thus ensuring occupants' beverages are delivered at the optimum temperature for the relevant season, the marque has witnessed significant interest in the myths and legends that endear so many to the brand. In this spirit, the time is now to reveal more of the truths that have defined the modern Rolls-Royce success story.

BY ROLLS-ROYCE



1) At prototype stage the 6.75-litre Rolls-Royce V12 engine had to faultlessly revolve 750million times before being approved for production.

2) The mechanism that retracts the Spirit of Ecstasy to prevent theft and damage is comprised of 24 unseen linkages and bearings.

3) 14 highly qualified Rolls-Royce engineers run a fleet of 16 intensive test vehicles 365 days a year on top of their normal workloads. They do this without complaint.

4) The sensors in a Rolls-Royce are so sensitive they are able to detect if a driver or passenger shifts their body weight from one side to the other and adapt accordingly.

5) The 1300 Watt, 18 speaker Bespoke Audio system in a Rolls-Royce is so exhaustively tuned, interior designers must seek the permission of the audio engineer who created it before making any design changes.

6) Much like the wood veneer inside a Rolls-Royce motor car, the weave of the carbon-fibre that makes up the central spine of Dawn's 'Aero Cowling' tonneau cover is expertly hand book-matched to achieve a perfect chevron pattern.



7) The marque's lauded Starlight Headliner began as a Bespoke request. A Rolls-Royce client was suffering from Photophobia, an extreme sensitivity to light, and was only able to enjoy reading his daily newspaper under the starlight on his rural ranch. He requested that the marque develop a similar ambience in his Rolls-Royce.



8) The marque's Bespoke designers increasingly facilitate commissions via mobile messaging services. Indeed, one of the first clients to take delivery of her Cullinan commissioned the motor car entirely via WhatsApp, witnessing the finished product for the first time upon its arrival at her home in the United States of America.

9) Before building the 'Clean Room' where the 'Gallery' fascia within Rolls-Royce Phantom is assembled, Associates from The Home of Rolls-Royce visited pharmaceutical and microprocessor Clean Rooms in order to fully understand these complex manufacturing laboratories.

10) A Rolls-Royce Wraith ascended the famous hill-climb at the 2015 Goodwood Festival of Speed in just 52.71 seconds. A feat that could not be bettered by two Maserartis, a Porsche and a Bentley.

11) Sommeliers advise that the optimum serving temperatures of non-vintage Champagne is six degrees centigrade and vintage Champagnes is 11 degrees centigrade. Rolls-Royce equips its motor cars with a refrigerator that operates two cooling modes, chilling to six degrees and 11 degrees respectively.



12) Phantom's world-leading sound insulating properties were employed by London-based musician Skepta, who was able to record a track in its entirety from the rear seat.

13) 4,500 automated electronic test and commissioning sequences are executed during assembly to ensure the car is crafted to its correct specification. A further 3,500 take-place once the car is finished. A car must pass every test before it is permitted to leave the factory.

14) Over 100 microprocessors decipher 130 million lines of code, ensuring every Rolls-Royce's suite of cutting edge technological features can be called upon instantly and seamlessly by the driver or passengers.



15) Over 25m of cabling is used to transfer audio data in a Rolls-Royce. Fiber-optic cabling is used to ensure immunity against interference.

16) In 2018, Rolls-Royce added shooting stars to its celebrated Starlight Headliner with eight shooting stars that fire at random across the ceiling panel.

17) To achieve the marque's mirror-like finish, 5 layers of paint are applied by the only robots you will find at the Home of Rolls-Royce. Any hard-to-reach spots are painted by highly skilled paint experts. In total the process of applying a flawless exterior finish takes seven days and uses over 100lb of paint.

18) Paint quality is checked by the most sophisticated measuring tool in the world: the human eye. If a car does not meet with the approval of the marque's notoriously fastidious auditors, it will be scrapped.



19) It takes 17 days to hand-craft the leather elements of a Rolls-Royce interior.

20) The most detailed single piece of embroidery to feature in a Rolls-Royce motor car is a Peregrine Falcon, the fastest bird in the world. The photo-realistic design consists of nearly 250,000 stitches and took a team of designers, craftspeople and engineers over one month to develop.

21) The 48 painstakingly crafted wood parts that comprise a Phantom interior take 28 days to produce. A sense of seamless flow of grain is ensured by only using wood from one tree for each motor car.

22) Mark Court is the only man in the able to hand-apply a perfectly straight Phantom coachline. In total it takes 3 hours per side. He uses special brushes made from ox and squirrel hair to ensure the line is precisely level and a uniform 3mm in width. He honed his steady-hand painting pub-signs.

23) Engineers will analyse cavities with an endoscope during monsoon water tests to ensure no moisture ingress. Should a car fail this test it will be scrapped.

24) A Rolls-Royce is so quiet, Sir Henry Royce ordered the fitting of signs at the factory proclaiming 'Caution, Silent Cars'. Modern health and safety dictates that craftspeople maneuvering cars around the Manufacturing Plant must intermittently sound the horn as a warning.

25) A Rolls-Royce rides on a 16litre air cushion married to dampers and springs that dynamically adjust themselves every

five milliseconds to deliver the marque's sovereign magic carpet ride.

26) When driven in a spirited manner the Rolls-Royce suspension system can draw on two high-torque electrical motors to minimise body-roll.

27) Legend has it that during a particularly spirited birthday celebration, Keith Moon drove his Corniche into a hotel swimming pool. This story is untrue – he was far too fond of his Rolls-Royce to let it come to harm.

28) When creating the Rolls-Royce Architecture, on which all contemporary Rolls-Royces are built, engineers incorporated a resonance chamber into the body's sill section. This, essentially, transforms the body of the motor car into a subwoofer, delivering exceptional low frequency audio performance.

29) A tailor made heat station brings every Rolls-Royce body to an exact temperature of 25 degrees Celsius to ensure that the rubber seal between the sunroof and the body is perfectly mated, this eliminates any road and wind noises over many years of driving.

30) It takes 60 pairs of hands 400 hours to build a Rolls-Royce – this can more than double depending on the complexity of a Bespoke commission.

31) Rolls-Royce sells cars on five continents. Should a customer live in a country without a dealer, specially trained technicians will fly to their home country to service their car. This small band of experts have been affectionately dubbed 'Flying Doctors'.

32) The brief given to the marque's engineers tasked with developing the roof mechanism for the Rolls-Royce Dawn was to create a silent ballet. They emphatically succeeded. While being the largest production convertible roof in the world, it is also the quietest.

33) During the testing period of the Rolls-Royce Dawn, lead Test and Analysis engineers were required to wear shorts so they were able to detect unpleasant airflow around their legs and feet. This testing was conducted in January at three degrees centigrade.

34) At 70 mph, a Rolls-Royce still has 90% of its power left in reserve.

35) A sensor within the Gallery Clean Room continually measures the particle concentration in microns – an alert is sent if particles are detected at a size larger than 0.001 of a micron. The width of a human hair is between 50-100 microns in diameter.

36) Every single component that makes a Phantom Gallery is painstakingly cleaned by hand inside a particle proof cleanroom before final assembly – this takes two people two hours to complete.

37) The Spirit of Ecstasy is so valued by the marque that there is a safe lock on the shop floor containing no more mascots than the necessary for one day of production. The code is known only by a small circle of craftspeople. ●

POLO RULES

RIGHT AND WRONG

Quick reaction and a near-reflex assessment of situations are of the essence of tactical play and safety. The next two examples highlight the right, and the wrong reactions in a given situation.

Situation 1 (left half of the field)

A player doesn't hit the ball hard enough and tries to hit it again by slowing down, or abruptly changing directions. Another player is directly behind the first player in playing position.

Wrong because:

A player hits the ball wrong and gives it a second try by slowing down or abruptly changing direction. There are other players right behind him in position to hit the ball.

Right:

A player, having messed up a hit, should carry on at the same speed without attempting a second hit. He should let a teammate take the next hit or, time allowing, go round and approach from the back of the field to attempt another hit.

Situation 2 (right half of the field)

In an attempt to hit the ball back in an off-side-back-shot a player gets into the way of an opponent who is in possession of the ball on his offside.

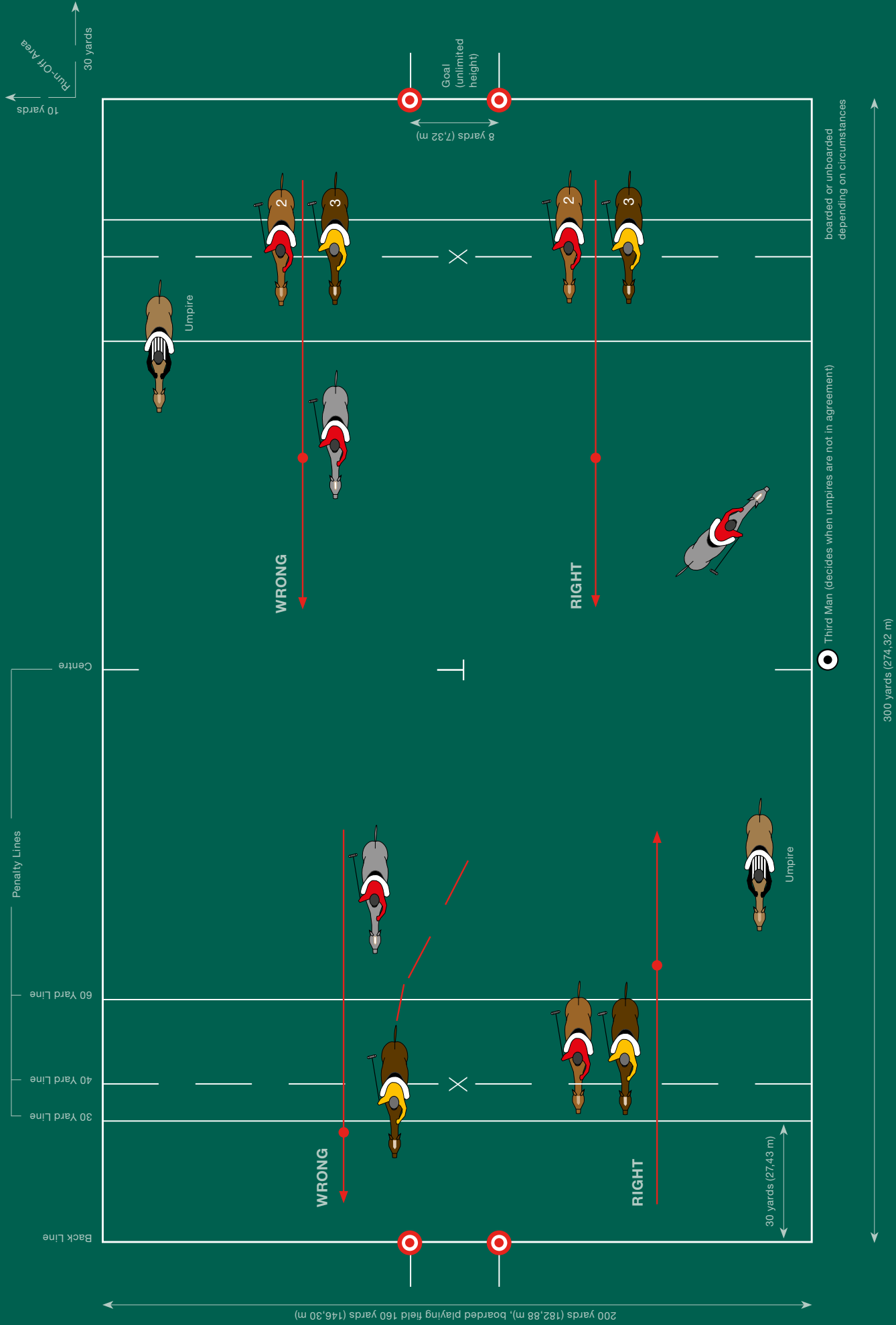
Wrong Because:

The defender infringes on the opponent's right-of-way in a manner that is not only dangerous but also unsportsmanlike. He has crossed the opponent's line leaving too little space between them and therefore puts himself and the other player in danger.

Right:

In order to cover his opponent correctly and effectively, the defender must wait until he can overtake his opponent and hit the ball in the opposite direction of play.

POLO RIDER CUP, a successful first edition!

The first edition of the POLO RIDER CUP, which concluded on the 20th June, hosted 12 teams from 8 different countries, and was a big success. This unique 10-day international event proved to showcase a top-class performance and a high level of competition among the teams on the grounds of the Polo de Chantilly, north of Paris.

With this new concept of competition, GAME Polo, the organiser and promoter of the event, wanted to re-establish the club's position in the sport and at the same time, with its experience in sports at all levels, work on a strategy to establish the POLO RIDER CUP as the World Polo Championship for Clubs in the FIP World Polo calendar with the best polo clubs from around the world on the same site.

The POLO RIDER CUP was played on handicap by teams with handicaps between 10 and 12 goals and a maximum of two clubs/

teams per country. The clubs that took part in the first edition were: Polo Club de Chantilly (France), Deauville International Polo Club (France), Hong Kong Polo Association (Hong Kong), Las Brisas Polo Club of Chicago (USA), Empire Polo Club of Coachella Valley (USA), Hamburger Polo Club (Germany), Polo Club Düsseldorf (Germany), Evviva Polo St. Moritz (Switzerland), Polo Park Zürich (Switzerland), Moscow Polo Club (Russia), Dos Lunas Polo Club (Spain) and La Aguada Polo Club (Argentina).

An extensive TV coverage for this first edition brought viewers closer to the action with a large number of digital and linear television channels, live-streaming across different platforms, daily news and highlights magazines. Some of the broadcasters and platforms included LeFigaro, beIN Sports, BT Sport, ClipMyHorse.TV, Horse&Country, HorseTV, Global Polo TV, SportDeutschland.TV, RTVE, PoloLine TV, among others.

Concerning the final of the tournament, Polo Park Zürich raised the 2021 POLO RIDER CUP Trophy after winning Deauville International Polo Club by 10 to 4 goals in the five chukkers of the final game. At the end of the match, Elena Venot from Polo Park Zürich was named the MVP of the tournament. Min Podestá, also from Polo Park Zürich, was the top scorer of the tournament with 29 goals and his horse 'Pirómana' won the BPP.

Before the final, the match between Hong Kong Polo Association and Empire Club of Coachella Valley was disputed for the 3rd place where the Asian team beat the American team by 6-5 goals in a close game.

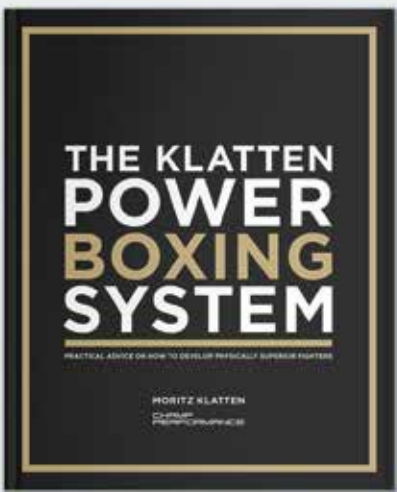

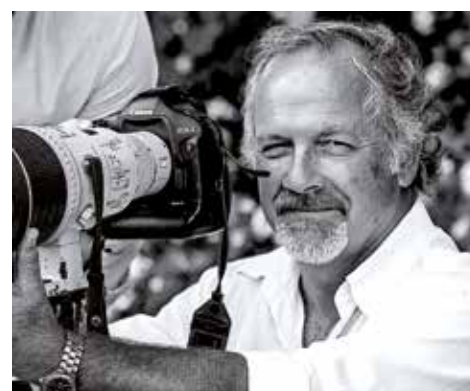
He has travelled around the world with this wonderful sport. From the hallowed green fields of the English countryside to the sun-drenched pitches in Australia and Spain and

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HEALTHY MUSCLE DEVELOPMENT IN HORSES

Julia Greb: Horse expert about how to ensure healthy muscle building.

After taking a long break from horse riding, equestrians are eager to start training. Many want to quickly make up for what has been missed in the last few weeks and months of injury. However, especially after a long break, it is important not to rush and overtax the horse during training in order to prevent injuries. Julia Greb is a personal trainer for horses and knows about the problems that many horse owners face on a regular basis. In the following article, the expert reveals 10 tips on the subject of healthy muscle building for horses.

Tip 1:

First of all it is important to focus on warming up. You should start light exercises about 20 minutes before training.

Tip 2:

Start at gait in order to improve the blood flow to the various muscle groups.

Tip 3:

Additional stretches while warming up will help stabilize the horse and activate the muscles.

Tip 4:

After a long break, it can make sense to first strengthen the horse from the ground. The weakened muscles should be built up before you start riding again.

Tip 5:

Furthermore, it is advisable to create a training plan. This helps you to remember

to work variably in order to really target all muscle groups.

Tip 6:

Make sure to include regular breaks in the training. In this way you avoid overloading your horse's muscles.

Tip 7:

As in every other living being, the muscles of horses are built up by the fact that there is a healthy proportion between tension and relaxation. Therefore, make sure that the ratio is in balance while training.

Tip 8:

After an intense training session, it is important that the muscles are given a break. This is essential for the individual muscle groups to grow and regenerate. Therefore, do not train your horse intensively on two consecutive days, but rather plan a relaxed training session on the following day.

Tip 9:

Also take the performance of your horse into account and adapt the training units accordingly. Overloading quickly leads to the breakdown of the muscles.

Tip 10:

In addition, you should pay attention to nutrition during the build-up phase. In addition to healthy mineral feed, feed other food supplements if necessary in order to ensure optimal functioning of the muscles. •

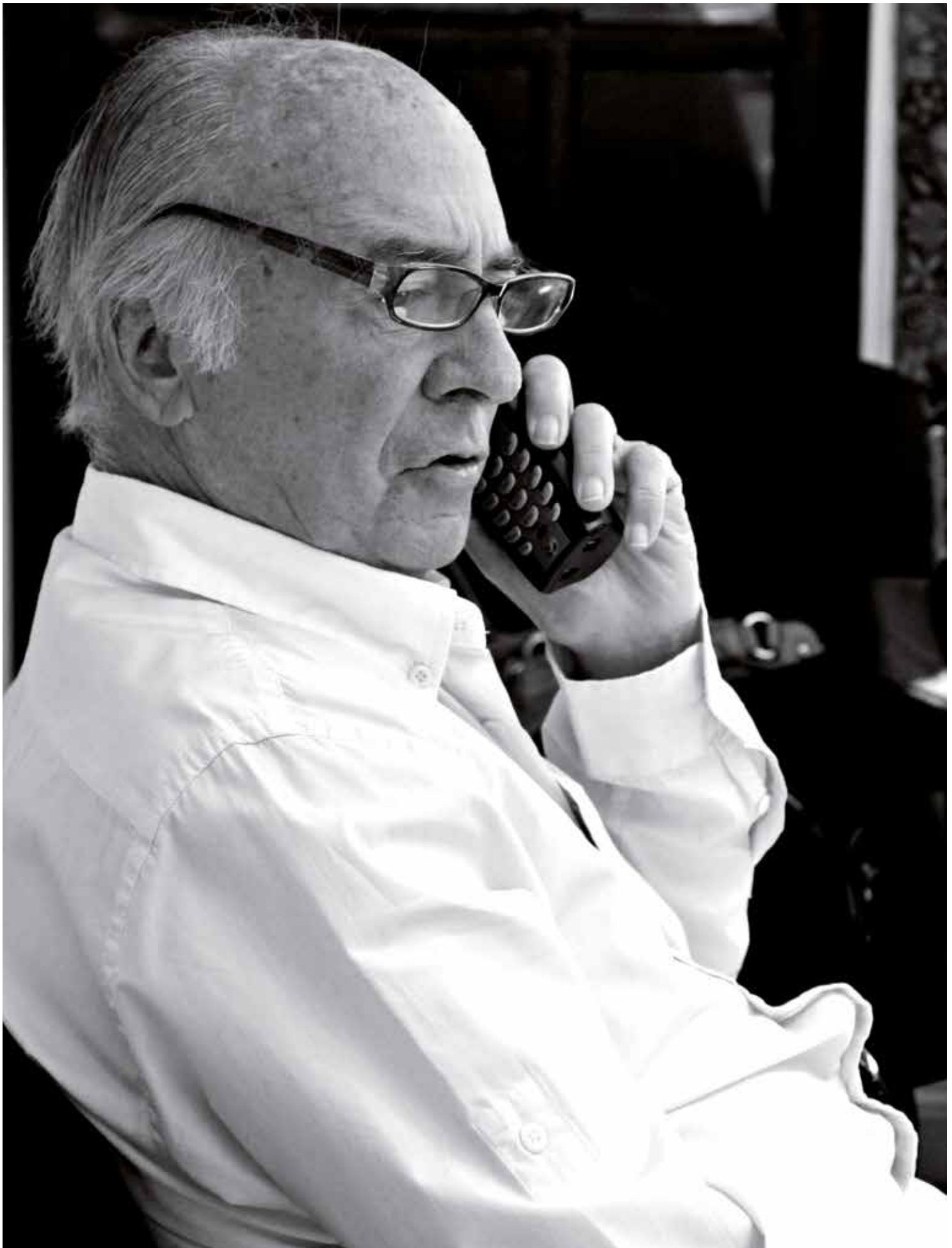
A MORNING WITH MARCOS URANGA IN DECEMBER 2013

Founder and first president of the Federation of International Polo, Marcos Uranga has worked a lifetime on promoting, organizing and spreading the word about the sport of polo.

During the 2013 Polo Open in Palermo, Buenos Aires, Argentina, POLO+10 had the chance of a lifetime. We were kindly invited by Mr. Marcos Uranga, the founder and first president of the FIP, to his home, and we had the opportunity to ask him some questions, while he took us on a journey back in time on polo history, and showed us the treasures he has accumulated over his years in the sport. With books, photos, trophies and medals we went on a memorable polo history tour.

Spending time with Mr. Uranga is experiencing a lifetime dedicated to polo. As Horacio Laffaye states in his book "Profiles in Polo", there is truly nobody who has surpassed his contribution in consolidating the different associations and federations throughout the world, gathering more than 70 countries into a worldwide organization: The Federation of International Polo. Today, the Federation is going through its 30th anniversary, and Mr. Uranga still remains active in it, as its Founding President.

Born in Buenos Aires in 1936, Marcos Uranga was the son of Carlos Uranga and Susana Rey, studied at Belgrano Day School, a bilingual English traditional school in the neighborhood of Belgrano, Buenos Aires. There, he started playing a different sport, but later on he translated to polo: Mr. Uranga has his roots in sports in rugby – "Thanks to my roots in rugby, I could envision the Federation as a worldwide family, the team spirit and the training and teachings of that sport broadened my vision in sports in general" – Marcos started playing polo as a diversion and a family sport, being taught by his father, and later became the captain of the Jockey Club team, once one of the most affluent clubs worldwide.

When asked the question about his milestones as a polo player, he highlighted playing and winning the first World Championship of Polo Clubs, that gave him the idea of starting the Federation: to make this event happen, the guest, Argentina, and the Jockey Club had to make sure there were horses for every polo player. Marcos Uranga, then Vice-President of the Argentinean Polo Association, started working on the idea of expanding the concept of the World Championship, and the idea of establishing the Federation was rooted. In 1982, the Argentinean Polo Association invited all national associations to a meeting, with the aim of joining forces to have a voice at the Olympic Committee, promote competitions, unify polo rules, and keep developing the sport among other goals. After that meeting held at the Jockey Club, Buenos Aires, Argentina, the Federation of International Polo was born, with Marcos Uranga elected as president.

Mr. Uranga is not only a recognized polo personality, he is an expert on agriculture and rural matters, and has had a brilliant career in top positions in Argentina, such as being named Director of the Banco de la Nación Argentina (Argentina's National Bank); he occupied positions in the Sociedad Rural Argentina (Argentinean Rural Society), and was second in command at the national Ministry of Agriculture. While occupying these charges, Marcos Uranga, together with Ignacio Uranga, also ran his estate, which is still running steady and prosperous.

When he speaks about his main goal for creating the Federation, Mr. Uranga states: "My goal was to create a big international polo family, a group of nationality-heterogeneous people, but homogeneous thanks to their affinity to polo. I believe that the goal of the sport is to unite the people, the nations, and most importantly, the family. We must practice the sport with the young people, internationally, and not look at competition, but at the comradeship between all" and then he highlights that "in the sport of polo, that comradeship is started from the beginning, when a local polo player lends his horse to a foreign one; the generosity in that act sets the principles of the true polo chivalry, regardless of the competition, and the different teams" and he continues "I am now 76 years old and feel my cycle is achieved. I believe in rotation of authorities, and the importance of giving voice to each of the different nations. If we wish to grow, we must renovate, the sport is in constant evolution, and so should the Federation be. I have initiated a project and have made it grow worldwide, reaching remote locations such as China, developing bonds throughout the nations, personalities, governments, players and families: this is the biggest legacy I could ever leave".



Marcos Uranga is awfully glad about the high number of youngsters playing polo in Argentina, mentioning that after the interview he will go to see his grandchildren play in the junior leagues, and the high number of kids starting to play at very early ages in the country: "The most beautiful thing I have is my 20 grandchildren, my seven sons and daughters, one of them, Paula, is married to Alberto 'Pepe' Heguy, a polo legend himself; and once I see my grandkids playing I feel a deep joy, to be able to help them, and to see them play with their parents, it is the best reward for all these years of work".

When asked if his main goals in the FIP were accomplished, Mr. Uranga has only one answer: a definite yes. Out of the blue when we were about to finish our interview, Glen Holden (former FIP President and Ambassador of the United States in Jamaica, among others) calls Mr. Uranga, and they schedule lunch together for that day, and then go to watch his grandsons play together. After the call, he only tells us "See? The true spirit of polo, we are really a family!". Mr. Marcos Uranga feels accomplished and satisfied, proud of the achievements of the "polo family" he once placed the foundation stone of, and everything about him proves this right. •

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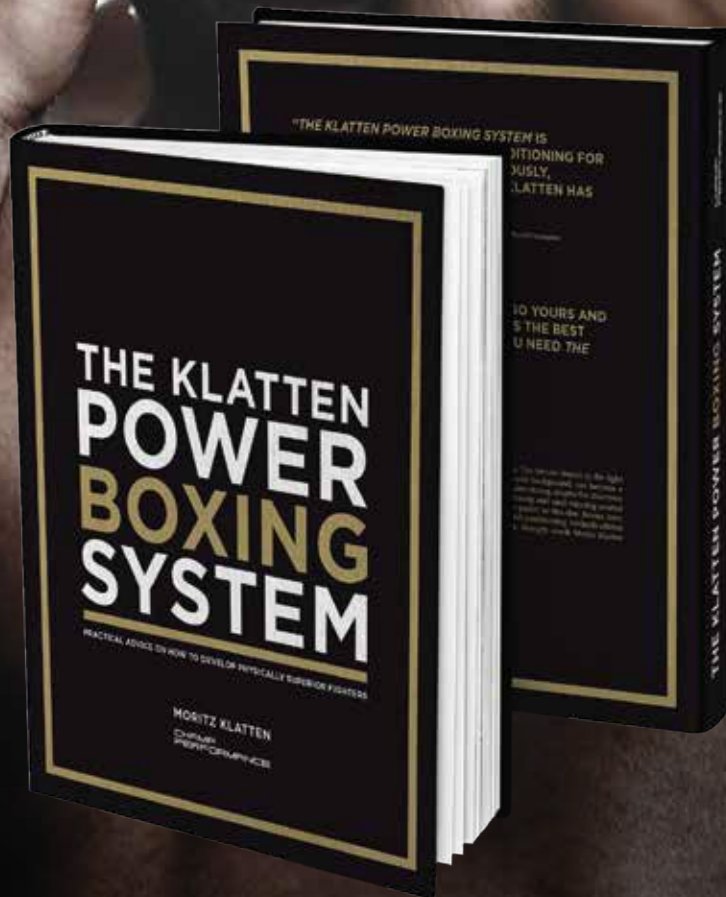
