The tenth Ladies Polo Cup in Deauville brought together the best talents of the international polo scene. A purely French team, led by Carole Muir and Alicia Prat, along with the talented sisters Elena and Pearl Venot, dominated the final against an impressive Argentine team, captained by Lia Salvo. With a final score of 10-6, the Frenchwomen claimed victory, once again highlighting the strength of women's polo.

The 25th anniversary (!) of the Zurich International Polo Ladies Cup was an emotional highlight of the season. For a quarter of a century, this cup has stood for progress and the empowerment of women in polo. Team Los Lobos demonstrated over a weekend full of intense competition that passion and teamwork are the foundation of any victory. Reclaiming the trophy was the crowning achievement of a weekend that will go down in the annals of polo history.

The POLO+10 tournament, organised by Iridike Polo, also made history this year. In a tension-filled final, Team Nairobi triumphed over Iridike after three days of gripping matches, where strategy and top athletic performances set the tone.

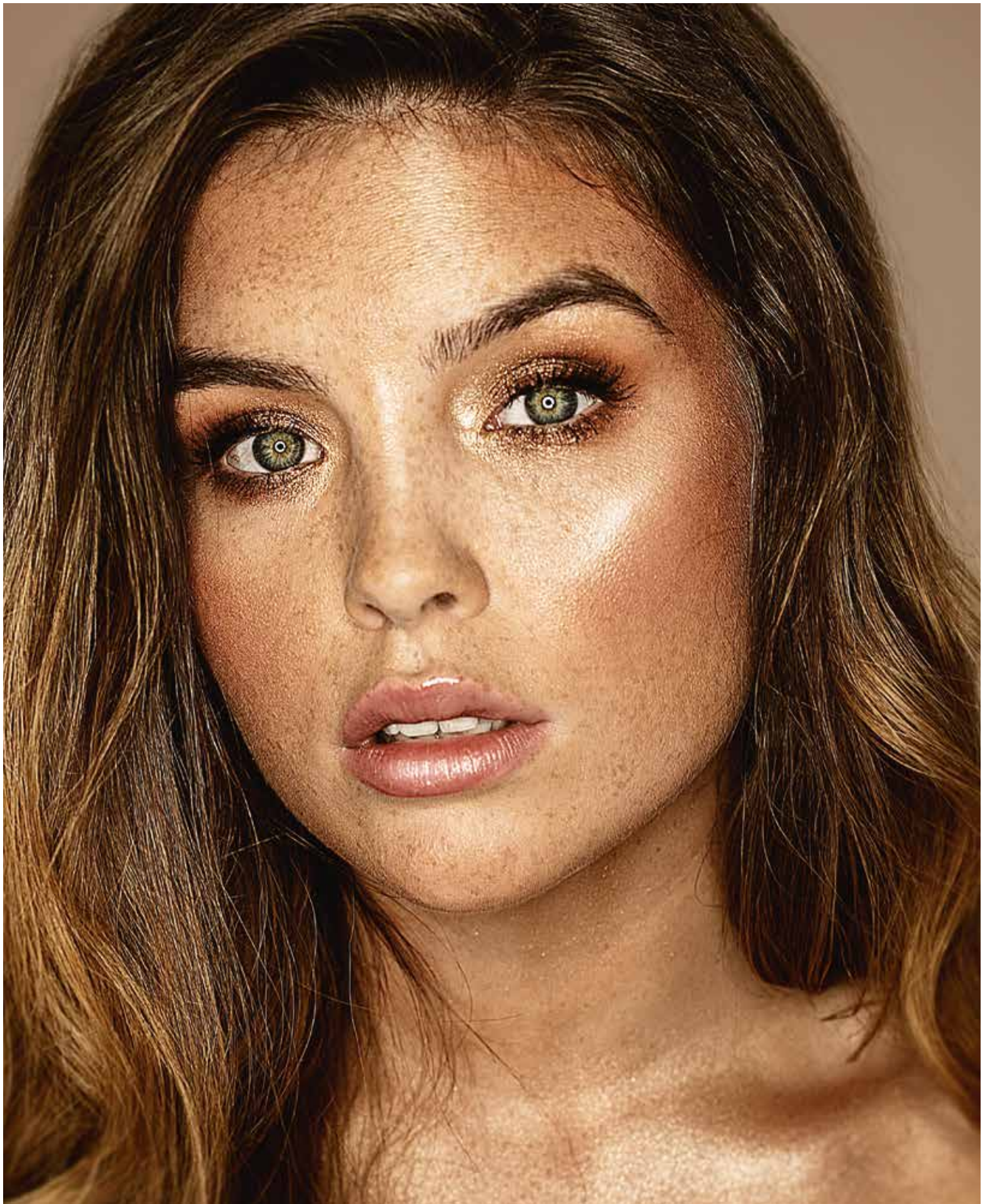

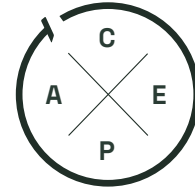

The qualifying and knockout rounds were particularly competitive this year, with plenty of last-minute thrills and some spectacular performances from the top players who will now fly to Buenos Aires for the highlight of the world polo season: the Tripla Corona.

The height of the French season was equally enthralling, with the two finals living up to the promise of the qualifying rounds.

In the women's competition, it was the revenge game between a team considered to be outsiders, Yves Delorme, made up of three players from the Polo Club du Domaine de Chantilly, Charlotte Garaud, Margaux Perruchot and Adèle Renaudon, reinforced by the Anglo-Australian Milly Hine, the reigning Argentine champion. On the other side, Luxembourg's Augustinus Bader with Argentina's Lia Salvo, two-time winner of the Argentine Open (with Millie Hine at her side): a duel within a duel. It was a rematch because Yves Delorme had beaten Augustinus Bader 11-5 in the pools: was that an advantage? Obviously it was, as the Chantilly Polo team once again dominated Augustinus Bader, although this time it was a little more complicated (9-7).

The key for the two professional champions was to make the most of the qualities of their three team-mates. "When I arrived here, explains Milly Hine, I was lucky enough to meet these three girls who knew each other well, who had played and won a lot together and who knew their horses well, so it was easy for me to use their qualities. We immediately got off well together and became friends, we did lots of things together off the pitch, we had dinners together as a family, and that togetherness is important in this sport. The other key was the incredible horses that Briec Rigaux gave me. In short, we had everything we needed to win. But my goodness, I had stage fright. When I arrived here and saw everything the club had put in place, the glamour of the Barnes Open and all the people who were here, I got a bit stressed and found it hard to fall asleep every night." Tonight, Milly will finally be able to sleep well.

Milly Hine and Lia Salvo will certainly meet again on 7 December in the final of the Argentine Open, this time face to face as they did in Chantilly: another chance for revenge?

Arthur Madrid: "Our secret? Harmony between the players".

In the men's competition, some were eager to see how the young Mungo team, also based at the Domaine de Chantilly Polo

Club, would fare against the solid Argentinian side La Fija Sandbox. This confident French team has been going from strength to strength since the Deauville Silver Cup last August. After a dominant start to the game, Mungo fought back to take a 10-8 lead in the fourth chukker. That was when Fran Elizalde picked up an injury and was replaced by Alfredo Capella. With this luxury substitution, La Fija Sandbox inflicted a 4-0 defeat in the final chukker to claim the title for their third participation. The secret of this team? More or less the same as the women's champions, according to Argentina-based French captain Arthur Madrid: "We had six fabulous games with these guys, including a final that was probably the most intense, very difficult match, and I'd like to congratulate our opponents, four ultra-fast players... the only secret in sport is harmony between players and that worked for us. We hardly knew each other before this tournament and we quickly became best friends. It's that understanding off the pitch that has given us our strength on it." Fran Elizalde adds on a more technical explanation: "We knew we were up against a strong team and we just had to be patient and play our polo. Despite a very long season, our horses were very competitive." The magical duo formed by this player and Rufino Bensadon will remain one of the most beautiful sporting images of this 24th Barnes French Open. ●

There was little suspense in this tenth anniversary women's final, apart from perhaps the first half. After that, the Doma Angels took full advantage of their opponents, who had beaten them by just one goal in the qualifiers. The key to their success: two sisters who have played together since childhood and know each other inside out. Today it was the youngest, Pearl, who scored 7 goals and was crowned MVP (most valuable player) of the final, a reward that matched the nomination of her horse, Besos, as BPP (best playing pony) of the final: „It's all thanks to Elena, who pulls me up," said the youngest. It's often thanks to her that I find myself in a position to score, even though we're always in competition with

each other during our games. But challenging ourselves in this way raises our level of play. Our horses were fantastic today. They've just come back from a month's competition in Mallorca and they arrived here in brilliant condition. They were incredible." The Doma Angels learned a lot from their first match, a hard-fought victory over Augustinus Bader: „Yes, the first match was indeed more complicated. We had to understand how the referees work here and analyse Lia's game, which was helped a lot by her teammates, especially Paloma (Lauro) and even Lucia Heyes, who got in my way today by protecting Lia. But Elena, who was slightly injured, played incredibly well."

The Venot sisters will be back in the French team tomorrow to face the „rest of the world" with the same desire: „Absolutely! Playing for France alongside Ambre Ploix and Paloma Lauro is even more motivating... We would have loved to play with Lucie (the third Venot sister), but with Ambre and Paloma we have two talented team-mates and we're more than optimistic."

Another source of joy for Pearl Venot is the nomination of her horse Besos as BPP: „I've been riding him for 10 years, he's always been my best horse and now he's finally got the title. He's 16 today and I've progressed with him since I was a beginner. Besos was very pleased with this recognition: he didn't leave a single carrot of his prize!" ●

THE SECOND POLO NATIONS CUP FOR FRANCE

Six nations competed in the Polo Nations Cup 2024, with the French team from Occitanie emerging as champions. Led by Isabelle Larenchamps, they secured their place in European polo history.

Six nations, including three newcomers to Chantilly, ten teams, twenty-five games, including those of the subsidiary cup won by Italy, ten days of tournament action ending in a beautiful final won by the French team from Occitanie. This is the outcome of the second Polo Nations Cup, now firmly established in the European calendar of prestigious competitions. This is the kind of tournament a captain wants to add to their list of achievements. On Sunday, that lucky captain was a Frenchwoman, Isabelle Larenaudie.

Over the past five years, Isabelle Larenaudie has built this fine Occitan team, known as Tédélou in other tournaments, around two Argentinian brothers who grew up playing polo at the Polo Club du Domaine de Chantilly. Simon and Ramiro Zavaleta are French at heart and speak the language fluently. This brotherhood is the strength of this team, which is completed by the talented Breton Jules Legoubin. From the outset, the French team took control of the match, leaving little room for the star of the Pakistan team, handicap 7 Tito Ruiz Guinazu: „We had a plan for Tito,” reveals Simon Zavaleta, „to neutralise him at all costs. Nobody was going to mark him in particular, but as soon as someone was near him, he had to be taken out at all costs.” The plan worked well, especially for Simon, who scored 7 of his team’s

8 goals, including a sublime “golaso” in the second chukker, and was rightly named MVP of the final: „On an individual level, it is a great reward, but this is above all a team performance. There were five of us who won this title, including Nicolas Corti Maderna, who replaced me in the semi-final when I was ill, and who qualified us for this final”. Unbeaten throughout the tournament, the team always led until Pakistan came back to 7-6 in the final chukker: „But Ramiro scored a magnificent goal at that point to give us a two-point lead and definitively some breathing space. I think it was a great game for the fans.

Then, in September, it’s time for the flagship tournament of the French season, the 24th Open de France (4-22 September), for which twelve teams have already entered nine of the world’s top forty players, including the title holder with Kazak, Nicola Pieres, a former winner of the Argentine Open. On 17 September, the women will be taking part in the French Women’s Open, which will also feature top players such as the winners of the Argentine Women’s Open, England’s Hazel Jackson and Argentina’s Lia Salvo. The aftermath of the Olympic Games will be just as sporting and just as enjoyable to savour for three weeks on the magnificent grounds of the Apremont Farm.

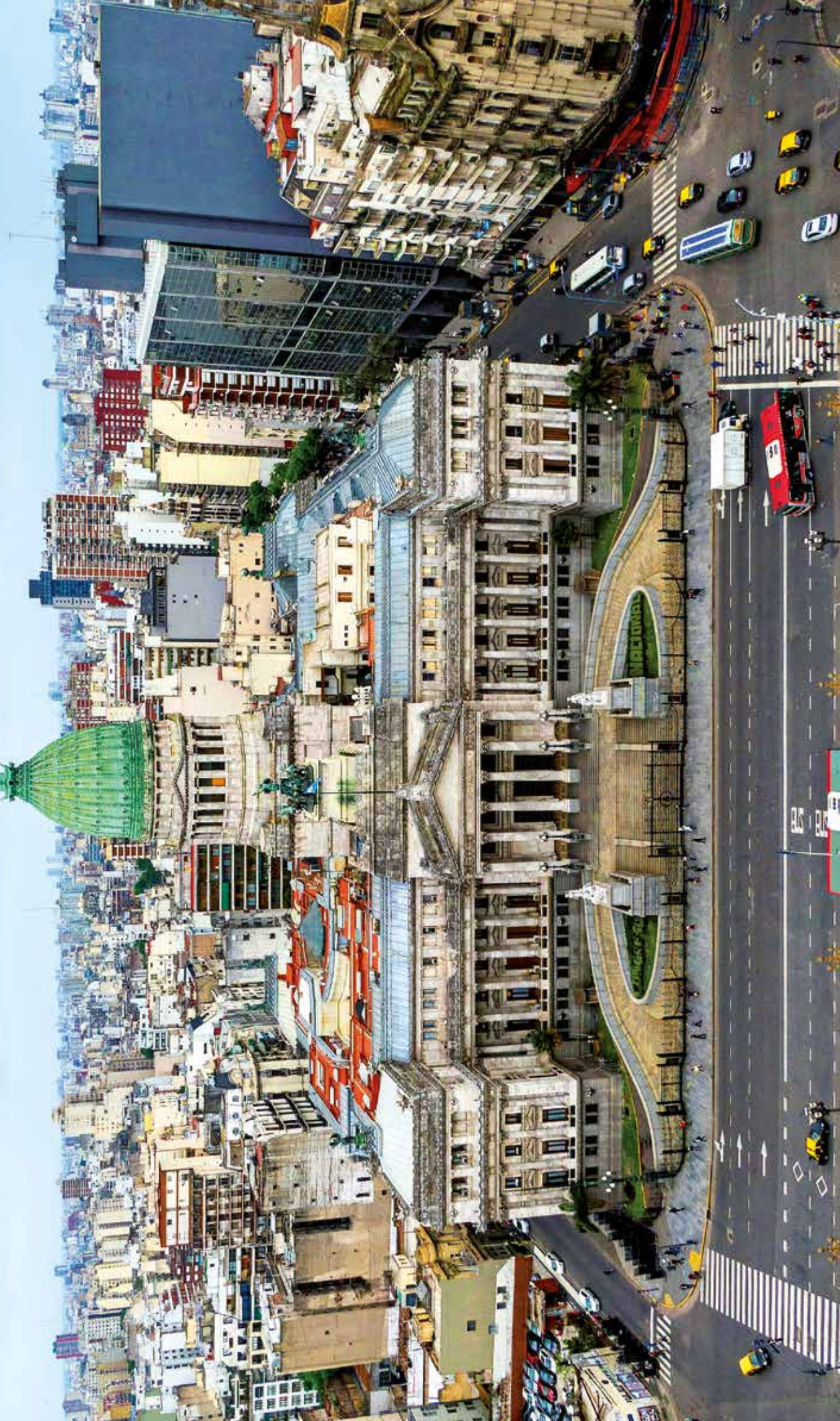

This workshop is none other but the home of the best polo boots in the world. The Fagliano family, who has been running the shop since its beginnings, opened their doors for POLO+10.

Once you go past the Fagliano doors, the smell of leather impregnating the air, the machinery, the endless shelves containing boot molds of all sizes, surely make you acknowledge you are in a very special place, that has a story that deserves to be told. Eduardo and Hector Fagliano, are the 4th generation of boot makers, and with their father Rodolfo, and Eduardo's son, Germán, they run the shop as their great grandparents used to.

The Faglianos have made and keep on making all their boots entirely by hand, with the processes and machinery they inherited, and without the aid of the latest technologies. Nowadays, in the age of mass production, the Fagliano boots have countless reasons that make them so outstanding. This

The Founder of POLO+10, Thomas Wirth, was able to speak with Eduardo Fagliano, who kindly answered some of our questions:

WHAT DO YOU THINK THAT IS THE KEY FACTOR THAT MAKES FAGLIANO BOOTS SO SPECIAL? DO YOU BELIEVE IT IS THE QUALITY, THE EXPERIENCE THAT HAS ENDURED FOR MORE THAN 100 YEARS, THE MATERIALS YOU USE...OR MAYBE YOUR (VERY) SINGULAR CUSTOMERS? Fagliano started with the arrival from Italy of my great grandparents, and, here, in Hurlingham, Buenos Aires, we have been working since 1892, so its more than 120 years of experience. I believe the key factor is the material selection. We always are very thorough in selecting the best quality to make every pair, according to what our clients expect and, of course, by accomplishing to make the whole process by hand, that also ensures the best quality.

WHAT DO YOU AND YOUR FAMILY FEEL WHEN A SPECIAL CLIENT CROSSES YOUR DOORS? YOU ARE FAMOUS TO HAVE HANDCRAFTED BOOTS FOR ROYALTY, CELEBRITIES, TOP POLO PLAYERS... THERE MUST BE SOME NERVOUSNESS STILL WHEN YOU GET THEIR VISIT! It is such a great experience every time we get a special visit, and we are really touched by it, and it is a reminder of the recognition that we have accomplished through all these years. Nevertheless, we believe that all clients should be treated like kings, and we bear that in mind always.

WHICH IS THE MOST SINGULAR PAIR OF BOOTS YOU HAD TO MAKE BY REQUEST?

Well, we sure had a lot... some of them include embroidering in leather club logos, monograms, initials, but there's always a new challenge coming up!

YOU ARE THREE GENERATIONS WORKING AT THE SAME TIME, IN THE SAME WORKSHOP, A FAMILY SETTING A HONEST EXAMPLE OF TRADITION AND PASSION ABOUT WHAT THEY DO. WHICH DO YOU THINK WERE THEIR KEY FACTORS IN YOUR UPBRINGING THAT MADE YOU FEEL THE EXACT SAME PASSION YOUR ANCESTORS DID?

We've been visiting the workshop ever since we were small kids, as our father did (he was born right here), and through watching our family work, we could experience how passionately they worked, thinking about how rewarding it was to do something that would be received by the client with deep affection. We started learning since early age, the very first steps, cutting the leather, or pinning nails everywhere, small tasks that gave us the possibility to learn the job, though you can never finish the learning process, there is always something new to discover. Our mentors always were open to our new ideas, because we always had the same goal: do our best, and keep on excelling the final product.

WE KNOW THAT YOU STUDIED SOME ENGINEERING TOO. DID YOU EVER THINK OF STARTING A SEPARATE PROJECT OR YOU JUST FELT THAT MORE KNOWLEDGE WOULD COMPLEMENT YOUR CRAFT?

I have studied Mechanical Engineering in the Universidad Tecnológica Nacional for four years, but I have not finished it. None-

theless, I was able to expand my knowledge in that years, that absolutely complemented my work here at the shop.

FOR THE FUTURE, WHICH ARE YOUR EXPECTATIONS FOR THE BUSINESS? Our will for the future is to continue with our quality standards, without rushing but also without stopping the progress. We sure hope our future generations, if they want, and God willing, keep the work with the same passion and dedication that we transmit to them.

AND LAST QUESTION, HOW DO YOU FEEL ABOUT POLO BECOMING MORE AND MORE POPULAR THESE DAYS, DO YOU FEEL IT WILL LOSE ITS "ELITE SPORT" ESSENCE? There is a special attraction to polo, and it was always that way. Nowadays, it is easier to start practicing it since amateur levels, the Polo fever has spread widely and it is easier to contact people that are involved in the sport and get you into it. I personally believe that the "elite sport" concept refers more specifically to put always first the principles of purity, quality and excellence in every aspect of polo. From our place in the polo world, we support that principles and hope that people keep working to keep that essence. ●

"Keep the essence", "purity" and "excellence", three adjectives that Eduardo Fagliano used for describing polo, unintentionally described the work that he and his family have been doing for so long. The Faglianos certainly know what polo is about, and live up to every aspect of it, in every pair of boots they make with such care and passion.

VERONIKA SVOBODOVÁ NECHYBOVÁ

THE IRON LADY FROM THE CZECH REPUBLIC WHO IS NOT AFRAID

Horse owner and showjumping enthusiast Veronika comes from the Czech Republic, a country where polo remains largely unfamiliar to the equestrian community. Two years ago, she embraced a new direction in her life after catching the “polo virus.” Now, she is on a mission to give polo a fresh new coat for the Czech audience.

FOR THE SECOND YEAR, YOU HAVE BEEN RUNNING A POLO CLUB RIGHT IN THE CAPITAL CITY OF PRAGUE, EVEN THOUGH YOU COME FROM THE WORLD OF SHOW JUMPING. HOW DID THIS COME ABOUT, AND HOW ARE THINGS GOING WITH THE CLUB? For health reasons, I had to stop participating in show jumping competitions. I lost a bit of my sense of purpose in life; suddenly, I had no goals ahead of me. I was only practising showjumping, but competitions are a thing of the past for me.

During that time, an American gentleman named Anthony Caine, a former polo player, came to my stables in Cholupice, Prague 12, looking for stabling for his two remaining polo ponies. He introduced me to the sport of polo, assuring me that this could reignite my passion. Through Chip, I arranged a lesson at La Republica Polo Club, which was then located at a different address. However, the club had real estate troubles and was looking for a new location, so I made a big life change and we moved the entire club to my estate. We built new stables, a field, and later also a 700-metre sand track.

SINCE CHILDHOOD, YOU HAVE BEEN RIDING SHOWJUMPING, AND TWO YEARS AGO YOU STARTED PLAYING POLO. WHEN YOU COMPARE THESE TWO DISCIPLINES, WHAT ATTRACTED YOU TO POLO? Just like in polo, there has been a lot of pressure in showjumping in recent years, not only on how well you ride but also on how high-quality a horse you have. This is also linked to financial aspects—how much a horse costs. In polo, you need more horses. If you want to play good polo, unfortunately, you have to play outside the Czech Republic. That is something I always wanted, as competing with others really excites me.

YOU MENTIONED THAT TO PLAY GOOD POLO, YOU NEED A GOOD HORSE. WHAT DID YOU DISCOVER WHEN YOU SWITCHED FROM SHOWJUMPING HORSES TO POLO PONIES? Polo ponies are incredibly hardworking, they are more intelligent and less demanding than showjumping horses. A showjumping horse is like a spoiled child that needs constant praise. Throughout my life, I have tried many equestrian disciplines, such as western riding, vaulting, or eventing, but the qualities of polo ponies have completely convinced me. For a long time, I struggled with how much contact polo involves for the horses. However, after my trips to tournaments abroad, I broadened my horizons and confirmed that if you take good care of your horses, they prove to you that it is a safe sport.

EVEN THOUGH FOREIGN LANGUAGES ARE NOT YOUR STRONG SUIT, YOU ARE NOT AFRAID TO TRAVEL TO TOURNA-

MENTS ABROAD. IN ADDITION TO HAVING ALREADY PLAYED IN SIX INTERNATIONAL TOURNAMENTS, YOUR HIGHLIGHT WAS THE LADIES CUP 2024 AT POLO PARK BERLIN, WHERE YOU PLAYED WITH IRISH PROFESSIONAL PLAYER APRIL KENT. HOW WAS IT PLAYING WITH HER? Yes, languages are a big challenge for me, but I’m not afraid because I have many great people around me who help me with that. Therefore, I always travel to tournaments with a groom who assists me with translation. Playing in the Ladies Cup in Berlin was an incredible experience. April coached us the entire time, constantly encouraging and supporting us as much as she could. Even though we didn’t win the tournament, I confirmed that polo is a great game when you have a professional pushing you forward.

YOUR ESTATE, WHICH YOU HAVE BEEN RUNNING WITH YOUR FAMILY FOR OVER 30 YEARS, IS LOCATED IN THE CZECH REPUBLIC—A COUNTRY THAT DOESN’T HAVE A STRONG RELATIONSHIP WITH POLO. DO YOU THINK THIS SPORT CAN ACHIEVE NATIONAL RECOGNITION LIKE SHOWJUMPING OR RACING?

I really hope so, just like I wish success to other local clubs and individuals who are intensely involved in polo. However, I fear that it will be a very challenging journey. Polo is largely unknown in the Czech Republic and unfortunately has a bad reputation among horse enthusiasts, which is not based on truth. Polo is safe if the rules are followed. It will be difficult to give it a good reputation. To promote this sport, you need substantial infrastructure, fields, and many horses. In showjumping, you only need one horse; in polo, you need at least three if you want to play an international match.

WHAT DO YOU WANT TO ACHIEVE IN POLO, AND HOW ARE YOU LOOKING FORWARD TO NEXT YEAR?

When I started playing polo, I wanted to have a positive handicap. Now, after playing for three years, I’ve realised that it’s not so easy. However, I train a lot to achieve a handicap of +2 to +3 and to travel to tournaments abroad and win.

WHAT ARE YOU LOOKING FORWARD TO IN 2025?

The 2024 season has been very successful for our club, and compared to the first year, I was immensely happy with this season. I hope we can continue this, and that La Republica Polo Club will participate in more tournaments as a team. ●

1. Nairobi – Demonstrating exceptional skill and determination, Nairobi clinched the first-place title, solidifying their status as the top team of the tournament.

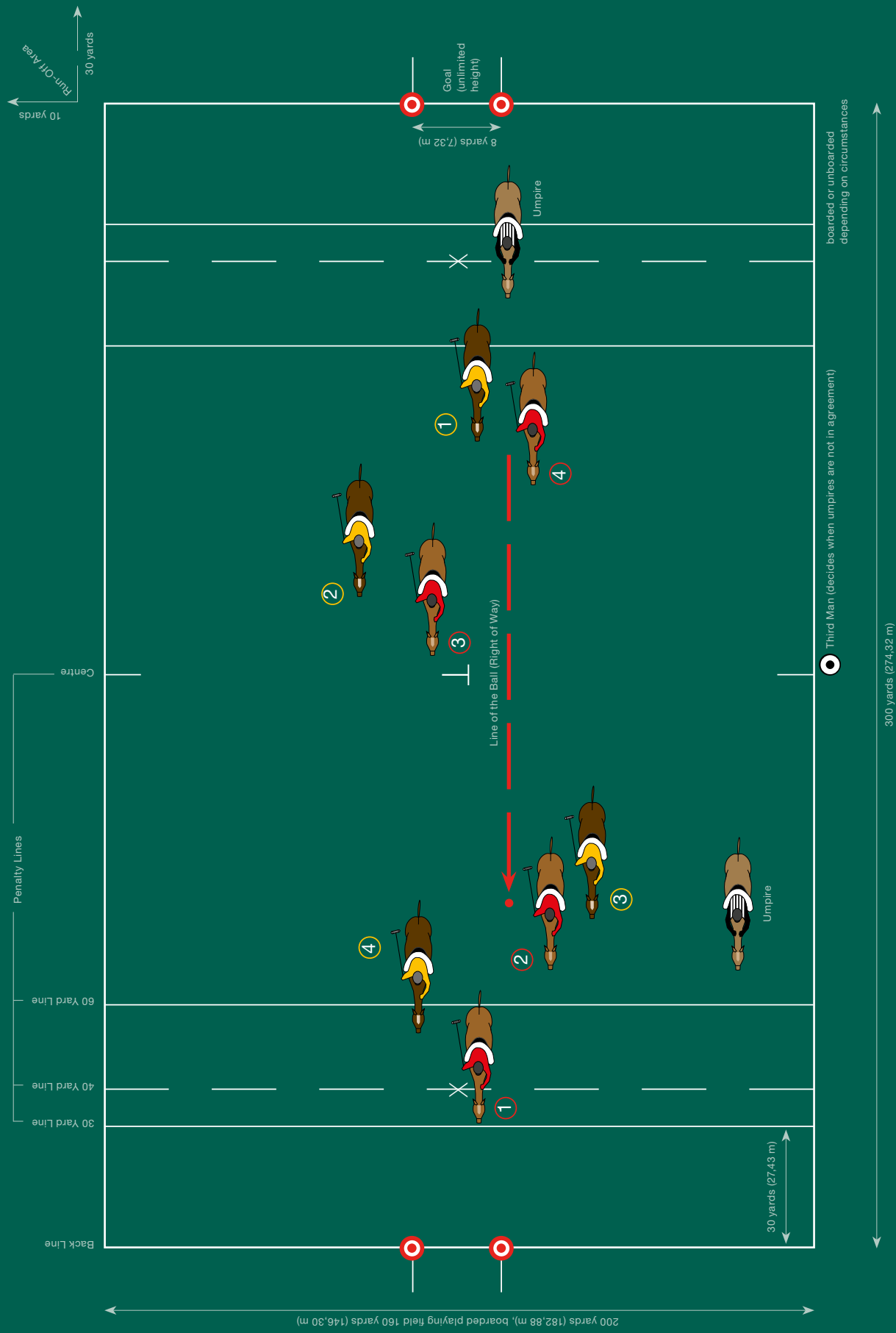
2. Iridike – Despite a valiant effort and a closely fought final, Iridike finished in second place, showcasing their competitive edge and sportsmanship.

POLO RULES

The rule No.1 in polo sports is the "Line of the Ball" - the so-called right of way.

The rules of polo and penalties can appear to be very complicated. Generally, the rules of polo are intended to keep ponies, players and spectators safe and as players and umpires keep this in mind, they aim to experience safe and fast polo. The principal rule and the rule most frequently broken at the same time, is the right of way: very simply, the player and horse that are following the exact course of the ball with the ball on their right hand side and moving in the same direction as the ball has the right to safe access to play the ball. Therefore any other player who attempts to play the ball by putting themselves or their horse in the space the first player needs to play the ball would commit a foul.

There has been a move within polo globally to speed up the game and to encourage positive play and prevent players manufacturing fouls or trying to create fouls to win penalties from less experienced players.

YOU ARE THE ORGANIC BOTOX PIONEER AND HAVE ENJOYED SUCCESS ON THE MARKET FOR NEARLY 10 YEARS. WHAT INITIALLY MOTIVATED YOU TO FOUND SPILANTHOX? WHY EXPRESSLY NATURAL COSMETICS?

We keep our promises. The effectiveness of the products can be seen and felt, and it has been proven in independent clinical in-vivo studies (involving a group of women aged 35 to 65). The results were groundbreaking! After four weeks of consistent use, wrinkles are reduced by up to 82%. It's remarkable. I also develop and thoroughly test everything myself before I release a product for production. I don't know of a single company that has an owner who is involved like this to such a large degree. It's really a genuine "owner-managed family

business" that still vouches for the quality with its name. And that isn't a marketing gimmick, it's real.

HOW DID YOU COME UP WITH SPILANTHOL AS A MIRACLE INGREDIENT AGAINST WRINKLES AND LINES?

I discovered spilanthol by chance at my dentist's. He was the one who told me about it. I haven't been able to tolerate anesthetics since my cardiac arrest and spilanthol is basically an herbal anesthetic. In England, it's called the toothache plant, for example, and the plant is also chewed for toothaches in South America. It anesthetizes the nerve receptors reversibly,

which means that the effect wears off after some time. I then did a lot of research and found numerous studies, including some that covered its effect on skin texture. That's when I came up with the idea of a natural cosmetics range with spilanthol, as I no longer looked quite as fresh due to my illness. I thought, wow, this is a great natural alternative to Botox or fillers.

WHAT IS BEHIND THE NATURAL ACTIVE SUBSTANCE OF THE JAMBU PLANT?

Paracress, which is another name for the jambu plant (botanical name: *Acmella oleracea*), contains the active substance spilanthol. If the dosage is sufficient, it immediately smooths expression lines and relaxes the facial features. Long-term use also reduces the depth of wrinkles. Its effect on the dermis is generally well known and valued. By now, it has become a popular active substance for the visible and rapid reduction of facial wrinkles. It's wonderful for relaxing crow's feet, forehead lines, or lip lines. But the dosage must be pretty high to result in visible smoothing. And that's what we did.

IN WHAT WAY ARE SPILANTHOL AND PARACRESS THE SAME THING?

Spilanthol is an extract from the paracress plant.

DOES IT MAKE SENSE TO CALL THE ACTIVE SUBSTANCE ORGANIC BOTOX?

The media coined this term, more or less. And I like it because it wonderfully conveys the effect of the paracress. Ultimately, this is a gentle and natural way to smooth expression lines and the overall skin texture. Just not as strongly and without a mask effect, and, of course, it's reversible.



ARE PRODUCTS CONTAINING SPILANTHOL MORE LIKE SMART INSTANT HELPERS OR DO THEY ALSO PROVIDE LONG-TERM RESULTS?

I can only confirm the long-lasting effect of my products. But yes. With continuous use of highly dosed products, you can minimize wrinkles for a long time.

HOW EASY WAS IT TO IMPLEMENT SPILANTHOL AS A BUSINESS IDEA? WHAT WAS THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE?

Establishing a company in Germany is a challenge overall. Especially as a woman. I could probably fill a book if I had to list every single challenge. But aside from the challenging business climate here, I myself was one of the biggest challenges. Because I founded the company at a time when I hadn't recovered yet. I was still battling heart problems and the resulting panic attacks. Also, I was still physically ailing in general. But I made it.

YOUR PRODUCTS ARE AVAILABLE EUROPE-WIDE AND NOW YOU ARE ALSO EXPANDING INTO THE UNITED STATES?

Yes, starting at the end of 2024, our products will also be available in the US, which makes me immensely proud. I've never been someone who seeks a lot of attention. I prefer to work quietly and then present everyone with successfully completed facts. No, seriously: the US market needs a product range like Spilanthol. We will also be pioneers there in the field of natural cosmetics with active substances, so we're opening up a new market there.

HOW DO YOU WORK WHEN YOU DEVELOP PRODUCTS?

I think about what could help me look fresher and better, and what might save me time in my skincare routine. After all, my needs are the same as those of many other women. I also keep looking around for natural raw materials that have a scientifically proven benefit for the skin. I don't care for new skincare products with trendy ingredients that don't actually benefit the skin at all. And as soon as I have an idea, I go to our chemists in the lab.

WHAT ARE YOUR PERSONAL BEAUTY FAVORITES?

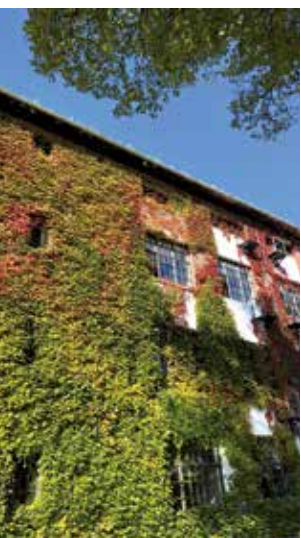
Definitely our Extreme Night Repair. This is my knight in shining armor, no matter at what time of year or how little I've slept or how stressed I am. With the Night Repair cream, I still look fresh and "de-crinkled". I also carry our hand cream with me at all times – especially when traveling. It's the first hand cream in the world with smoothing power that has been proven in clinical in-vivo studies. It's also great as an emergency lip balm or facial care. 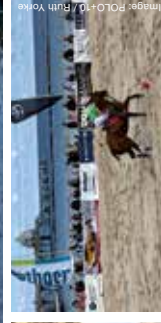
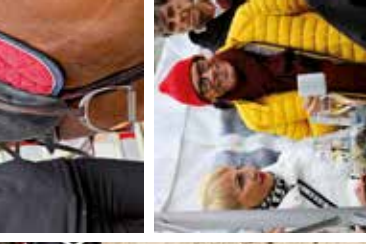
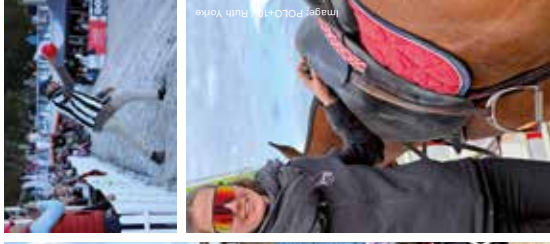
WHAT DO YOU LIKE MOST ABOUT YOUR JOB?

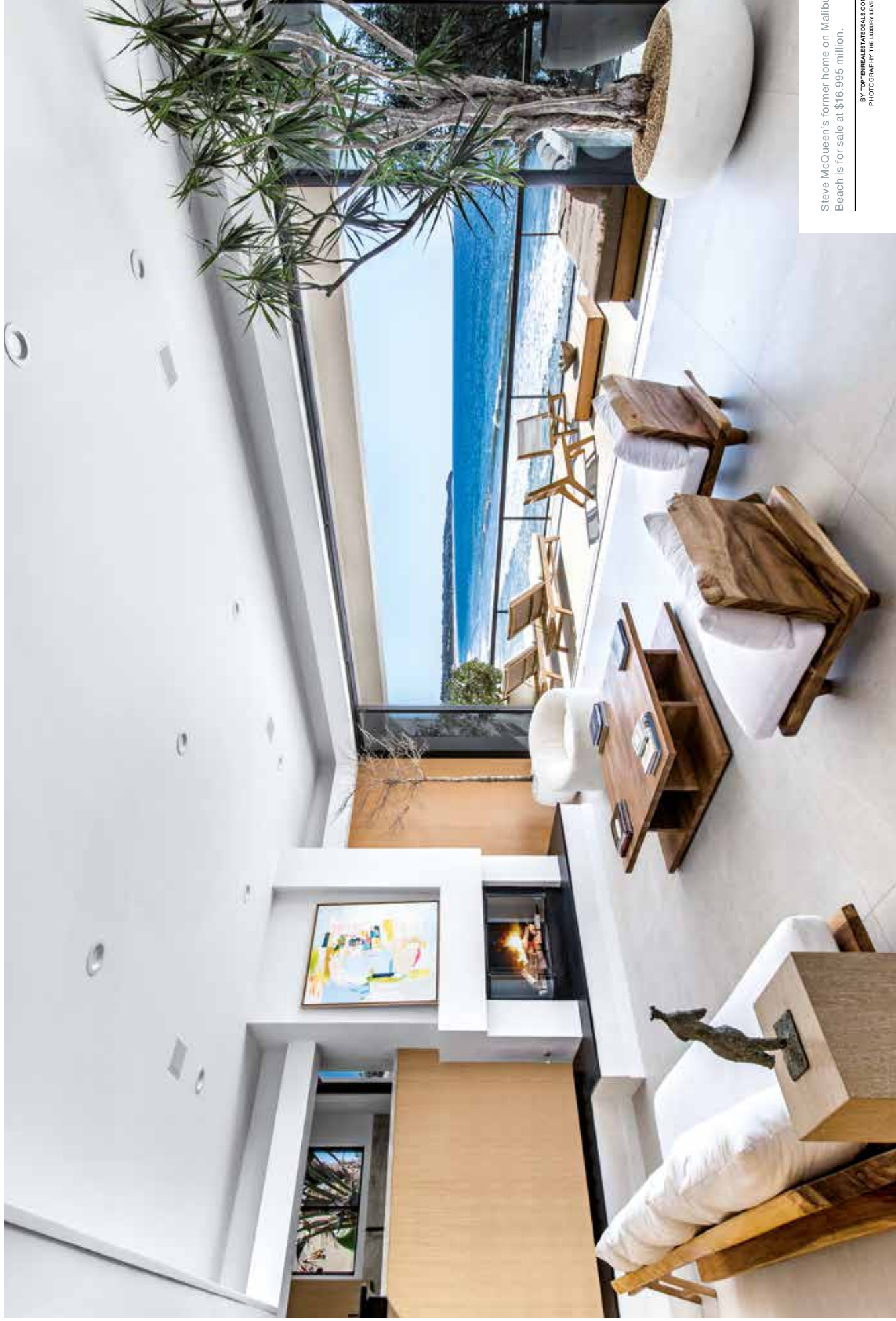

A favorite actor for baby boomers and one of the highest-paid actors in the world in the 1970s, Steve McQueen was the epitome of cool, both in real life and his movies, including *The Thomas Crown Affair*, *The Great Escape*, *Bullitt*, *The Cincinnati Kid* and *Le Mans*. Steve and his equally-big-movie-star-wife, Ali MacGraw, lived in Steve's Malibu Beach home for a few years in the 1970s, which is now completely updated, just as cool as Steve was, and for sale at \$16.995 million.



Recently sold in 2020 by Steve's son, Chad, and then to songwriter Ammar Malik, (Maroon 5's "Moves Like Jagger") for \$8.35 million, who spent millions to transform the property from a dated beach home to one of Malibu's best. Located on a bluff to provide the privacy that the Indiana-born McQueen wanted, the four-bedroom home is now California contemporary with over 4,300 square feet, including four bedrooms, dining, and living rooms, plus several wide decks. Huge sliding doors open the first floor, which feels as though it is floating above the ocean, to some of Southern California's best views from Broad Beach to Point Dume. The primary bedroom sets above the main floor with a soaking tub and large deck. More features include outdoor showers, a fireplace, chef's kitchen, wood-accent walls and spa bath. A private staircase leads down to the iconic beach.



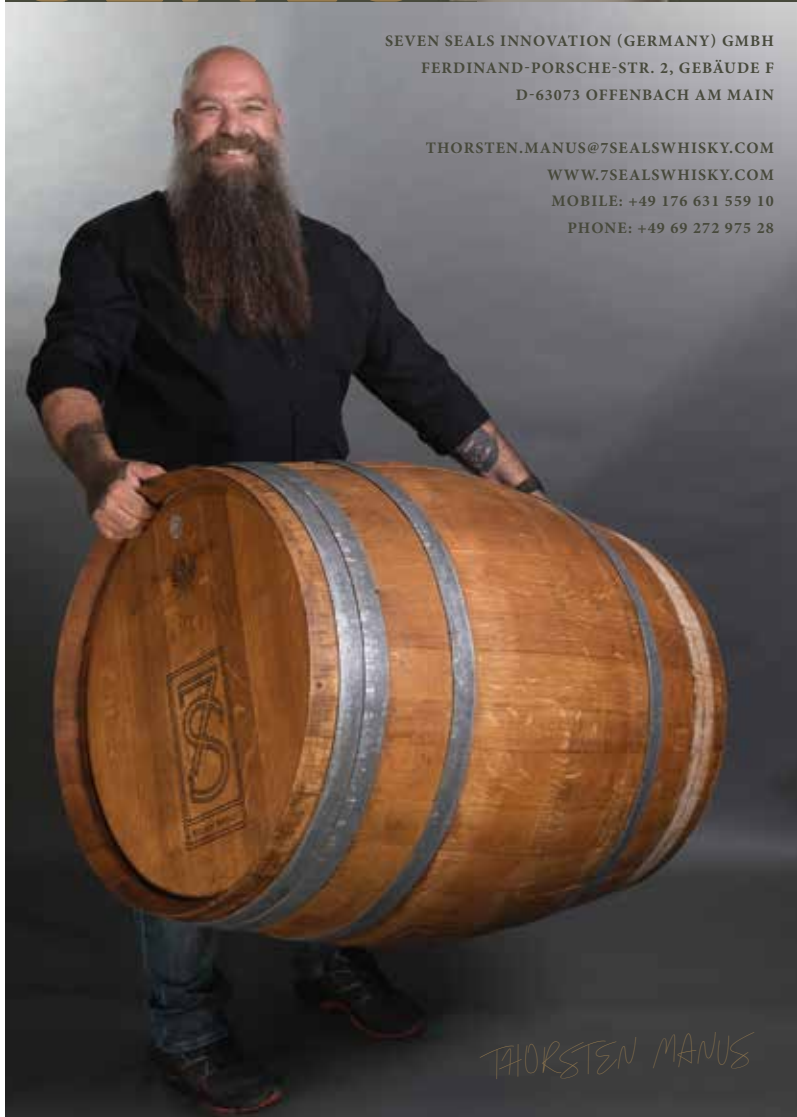
McQueen lived in Malibu when it was still a remote area near LA popular with surfers and a few actors. Today, Malibu is one of the country's most popular and expensive beach towns with spectacular mansions and upscale shops. Still extremely popular with actors, current and former homeowners include Leonardo DiCaprio, Emma Stone, Miley Cyrus, Jack Nicholson, Jenifer Aniston, Britney Spears and Cher.
