- 2025 in the anniversary year, after 50 years locked away in safety, these XV irretrievable Polo documents are numbered and offered for sale worldwide as valuable gifts for Polo friends.



While they clinched the Copa Cámara, the final of the 131st Argentine Open ended in a clear and surprising defeat against La Natividad – a result that will be remembered not for the score-line, but for the incredible level of play that once again defined this iconic tournament.

Another highlight was not a tournament, but an experience: Selman Marrakech – a place devoted to the art of riding, Arabian horse breeding, and refined hospitality. Set against the backdrop of magnificent oriental architecture, Selman offers not only a luxurious retreat, but also an authentic experience for riders and horse lovers – a place where the spirit of polo can be felt in a truly unique way.

AlUla, Saudi Arabia, January 20, 2025 – The Richard Mille AlUla Desert Polo 2025 set new benchmarks. With a spectacular finale and a record-breaking number of spectators, this year's tournament became the largest in its history.

Against the breathtaking desert backdrop of AlUla, six teams featuring world-class players, royals, and international patrons competed in two days of top-tier polo. Team Richard Mille, consisting of Pablo MacDonough, Mohammed AlSewedy, and Clare Milford Haven, secured the title with an 8-6 victory over Team Ikmah. Team Bentley claimed the Subsidiary Cup, while Team Dadan won the Wooden Spoon Cup.

Attendance rose by 14 percent compared to the previous year, further establishing AlUla as an emerging global hotspot for sports and tourism. Ziad AlSuhaibani, Chief Sports Officer of the Royal Commission for AlUla, emphasized the growing significance of the tournament and praised the high-quality matches and international appeal of the event.

With ambitious plans for expansion, the tournament continues to grow and remains a key fixture on the international polo scene.

SPILANT HE OUEEN OF "ORGANIC BOTOX" GOES USA. A UNIQUE SUCCESS STORY.

Spilanthox combines nature and science for visible anti-ageing results – founder Nikki Benett in a POLO+10 interview about her vision, the power of Spilanthol and the road to international success.

As my health history meant that I no longer looked quite so fresh myself, I thought to myself: this could be the perfect natural alternative to Botox!

THE EUROPEAN PRESS OFTEN CALLS SPILAN-THOL "BIOBOTOX". IS THAT A SUITABLE TERM?

Yes, I actually think it's very apt. It perfectly describes what spilanthol does: a natural, gentle smoothing of expression lines – without any mask effect and without the risks of injections. And best of all: the effect is reversible, so that the natural facial expression remains intact.





WHAT MAKES YOUR PRODUCTS UNIQUE IN COMPARISON TO OTHER NATURAL COSMETICS?

Our biggest unique selling point is that we keep our promises. Our products are not only natural, they also have a visible effect – and this has been proven by independent clinical studies. After four weeks of use, we were able to demonstrate a reduction in wrinkles of up to 82%. As the founder, I am also involved in every stage of development, test all products extensively myself and only then release them for production. Our company is a genuine owner-managed family business that guarantees quality – and that's not just a marketing message, it's reality.

SPILANTHOL COMES FROM THE PARACRESS – BUT IS IT THE SAME?

Paracress, also known as jambú, is the plant from which spilanthol is extracted. This means that spilanthol is the active ingredient that provides the relaxing effect on the facial muscles.

ARE YOUR PRODUCTS MORE OF AN IMMEDI-ATE HELP OR DO THEY ACHIEVE LONG-TERM RESULTS?

Both! The effect is immediate: the skin immediately looks more relaxed. But with regular use, deeper wrinkles are also reduced because the muscles build up less and less tension. Over time, the skin acquires a smoother texture – without losing its natural expression.

SPILANTHOX IS GROWING STEADILY AND IS NOW EXPANDING TO THE USA AND THE MIDDLE EAST. DO YOU HAVE RESPECT FOR THIS NEXT STEP?

This is a huge milestone! And yes, I have respect and sometimes I'm surprised at my own courage – or madness, depending on how you look at it... Our products will be available in the US from this summer and I'm really looking forward to it. The US market offers a great opportunity because high-quality natural

cosmetics "Made in Germany" with proven promises of effectiveness are in demand there. We will also be pioneers in our field there. And pioneers are celebrated in the USA. Ideas and visions still have a chance there. Germany has long since ceased to be a country known for innovation or visionaries. That always makes me a little sad, but you have to accept it. I feel up to the task of expanding, but of course I also have a healthy respect for this milestone. There is a lot of hard work ahead of us and also certain risks. I hope that everything will go according to plan. And I see problems more as projects that need to be worked through. This attitude will help us to accomplish this major task. And I'm also really looking forward to the Middle East market from autumn 2025. It's an exciting, rapidly growing market.

WHY IS EXPANSION SO IMPORTANT TO YOU?

Germany is no longer a business-friendly country. It is becoming increasingly difficult for us to earn money and remain competitive due to constant new burdens and restrictions. Purchasing power in Germany is also falling. As an entrepreneur, you almost get the feeling that politicians want to abolish "Made in Germany"... German companies must now expand strongly and penetrate growth markets, otherwise we will face a difficult future.

BEING SELF-EMPLOYED AND THEN EXPAND-ING ALSO MEANS A LOT OF RESPONSIBILITY.

HOW DO YOU MANAGE TO SWITCH OFF? For me, there is only one real balance: nature, peace and quiet, animals and few people. Whether at my house by the Baltic Sea or in the stables with our horses – as soon as I'm outside, I can take a deep breath and recharge my batteries. As I prefer nature and our animals to people and jet-setting, you're less likely to see me on red carpets. I think I've realised what really counts: family, friends, health and slowing down. •

8TH ARGENTINE WOMEN'S OPEN





La Dolfina's 2024 results were mixed, at least in terms of the legendary team's standing: Copa Cámara winners, Team III (Valiente) narrowly failed to qualify for the play-offs (outstanding game, by the way); Mia Cambiaso's women's team reached the final but lost to Overo Z7 and, above all, La Dolfina 1 failed to win a single Triple Crown trophy, losing again in the Abierto final to La Natividad. All this led to a transfer waltz for 2025 the very next week. Not a single 2025 team will resemble the 2024 line-up. Unheard of!

There were two matches in this 131st final of the Argentine Open. In the first four chukkers, La Dolfina seemed to have the match in hand (6-4 in the fourth) before taking a scathing 7-0 over the next three periods. It wasn't an exciting encounter, and the result was largely down to individual actions, particularly those of Jeta Castagnola. The conclusion is that La Dolfina (alone) will never win another sixteenth title, and that Adolfo Cambiaso is unlikely to equal the record of Juan C. Harriott Jr. who won the Abierto twenty times between 1957 and 1979 with Coronel Suarez's great team. But perhaps next year he'll join Harriott's teammate Horacio Heguy Sr. in second place with nineteen titles. To this end, Adolfo Cambiaso has managed to reach an agreement with his brother-in-law, Lolo Castagnola, to form the dream-team he has been fantasizing of for some time, with him alongside his son Poroto and his nephews, his sister Camila's sons Jeta and Barto Castagnola. In other words, an unbeatable team: we already know the name of the 2025 Argentine champion... And for Cambiaso, it will undoubtedly be the best outing at almost 50 years!

Behind this future Natividad-Dolfina is a whirlwind of transfers. Uruguayan Pelon

Stirling, Cambiaso's loyal lieutenant since 2011, has announced his retirement from the Abierto with nine titles under his belt, while Juan Martin Nero has signed for a new team, El Overo Z7, alongside Polito Pieres and Tomas Panelo (who are leaving La Hache) and Lukin Monterverde, promoted to handicap 9, who is leaving an Ellerstina that will clearly not be represented in 2025. Gonzalo and Facundo Pieres, on the other hand, will be reunited with the Heguy cousins at Indios Chapaleufu. Etc. etc. In short, there won't be a single 2024 line-up in 2025. An unprecedented upheaval in the history of the world's greatest tournament (see table).

Women's Open: La Dolfina loses... and recruits two of their winners.

No fifth title for Mía Cambiaso (despite a great match), her Dolfina having been led



from start to finish by titleholder El Overo Z7 UAE without the slightest debate. Hazel Jackson and, above all, Cande Araujo put in a great performance, with the latter producing some spectacular moves and finishing with some fine golazos. These performances earned both players a promotion to 10 goals, while their defender Millie Hine was upgraded from 8 to 9, as was Mía Cambiaso.

The debriefing and subsequent measures were swift on the La Dolfina side: exit Nina Clarkin, although she had been the main architect of La Dolfina's four victories; exit Lía Salvo, who didn't really get a chance to express herself within the team; and recruitment of American Hope Arellano and England's Millie Hine, the tournament's top scorer, thus stripping El Overo Z7 of two key players. It's a strategy not unlike that of Adolfo Cambiaso, who, after being beaten by Ellerstina in 2010, "stole" Pablo McDonough and Juan Martin Nero from his opponents in order to win nine Abierto with them!

The "repechaje", the match you had to see.

The repechaje is the play-off between the Copa Cámara winner and the eighthplaced team in the Triple Crown standings (bearing in mind that the ninth and tenthplaced teams will have to qualify again in 2025). The Copa Cámara is to the Argentine Open what the Europa League is to the Champions League in soccer. The "second league" with teams of 24 to 31 goals, of which there were sixteen this year. Interesting matches to watch, often fierce as was the final between La Dolfina Valiente (La Dolfina team 3) and La Ensenada II. La Dolfina Valiente won the match, which

earned them the right to contest the repechaje against La Hache Cría y Polo. This was undoubtedly one of the finest matches of the Argentine high season. Open polo, first-strike balls, long flights, a few golazos, an exchange of attacks from home to home and perfect suspense. A match dominated and perfectly controlled by La Hache for 6 chukkers, and then La Dolfina's revolt in the seventh and (normally) last chukker. A 3-0 scoreline, including a goal in the dying seconds, sent La Hache into extra time. La Dolfina had their work cut out when they were awarded a 60-yard penalty which Luquitas Criado just missed, while another shot hit the post. Finally, Toly Ulloa broke free to score the only goal of the game. All in all, La Hache Cría y Polo logically saved its fine season, while La Dolfina will be absent from the 2025 Triple Crown for the first time in a quarter-century!

ARGENTINA 2024 MILEI, INFLATION AND HORSE MARKET


The Argentine Open final was played under the watchful eye of President Javier Milei, who is clearly very popular in the Argentine polo world. True to his slightly... offbeat image, Milei didn't deprive his audience of the kind of show he's known for, combining exuberance and rather pleasant gestures: warm hugs with the players, including of course Cambiaso, of whom he's a fan, during the prize-giving ceremony, where he clearly enjoyed lingering. All this under the worried gaze of sixty members of his security team, including a few snipers posted high up in the stands, it seems.

Clearly, Dr Javier Milei, the embodiment of hard-line liberalism, has turned Argentina's economy around, wiping out the country's debt. On the other hand, the poverty rate is no better than it was during the Kirchner Peronist era, rising from 44% to 53% of the population living below the poverty line. The only fly in the ointment. He has also brought inflation under control, from 13% a month to less than 3% a month... after a surge of 25% the days after his election at the end of 2023. As a result, the cost of living in Argentina is now equivalent to that in Europe. For travelers, the bargains of the days when you could exchange euros and dollars at the "blue" rate on a parallel market with a 50% bonus on the official rate are over. The peso has stabilized, but at what price? Whereas in 2001, 100 pesos were equivalent to 100 dollars, today you need a big bag to carry the 100,000 pesos corresponding to the same sum (bearing in mind that the most common banknotes are 500 and 1,000 pesos and that very few new 10,000 peso banknotes- ≤ 10 – are in circulation).

These original 25% inflation figures have prompted several European polo players and aficionados to think again. Many have written off their travels. The fact that there were only four teams in the Women's Open was largely due to costs. The stands at Palermo's "Cathedral" were virtually empty for the quarterfinals (the "popular" Dorego stand was a little fuller, as it was free to enter for the first time this year), they were halfempty for the semi-finals and not really full for the final. Just ten years ago, tickets were snapped up as early as the quarters. The polo horse trade, although still fairly active, has clearly slowed down: "When you were offered horses for \$50,000 at the beginning of the season, the sellers would call back at the end of the season, before everyone had left, to offer them for \$20,000 for fear of having them on their hands during the winter", confided one European professional player. Maintenance costs have also skyrocketed: "Last year, my stable of around thirty horses cost me around \$50,000. This year, I had to spend \$150,000 for those same thirty horses", revealed the father of a professional player. Because, of course, professional polo players count in the dollars they earn in tournaments abroad. And in this case, Javier Milei's economic policy has clearly not done them any favors. But they love him!

It may not have been the most beautiful match of Hublot Polo Gold Cup 2024, but when the final is on the line the only appealing result is a win. During this final, polo was a sport of strategy, combat, and patience: and Britain's Max Charlton proved to be the strongest at this game. All the talent of Raul Laplacette could do nothing about it, despite being named best player of the match.

It was a defensive final which, naturally, concluded with a low score of 6-5. It was unbearable suspense until the end, with each team returning goals blow for blow. With only two minutes left on the clock, a remarkable individual play by Raul Laplacette leveled the score once again, and with mere seconds to go, Max Charlton took advantage of another 60-yard penalty. It was the goal that ultimately determined the match.

"Yes, it was a tough fight played out on penalties," the Briton admitted. "We won today because we were a little bit luckier than Gstaad Palace since both teams were on equal footing. But I'm particularly pleased to have won here, for Phillipp [Müller, his captain]. It's amazing!" J. Safra Sarasin landed on the third step of the podium.


Today's opening match, the final for third place, was clinched by French captain François Okala's team, donning the distinctive J.Safra Sarasin colors, after an actionpacked second chukker. Argentinian handicap 6 Horacio Fernandez Llorente led the charge, capturing four goals. The "blues" dominated the match from start to finish, after measuring up the pitch they only discovered last Thursday.

"Actually...not quite," Tete Fanelli was keen to point out. "This is the third time I've played here. I've been a finalist twice before but lost on both occasions. I thought this would be my year, so I'm not completely satisfied with third place. That doesn't stop me from enjoying this tournament enormously—the organization, the environment, the atmosphere. So I'm looking forward to coming back here and leaving with the watch!"

So, maybe this year from August 21-24. The date has already been set for this one-ofa-kind tournament, whose teams continuously express their satisfaction before they return home. This edition was no exception, an extraordinary celebration of polo that couldn't possibly be spoiled by a little cold on Sunday.

INTERVIEW WITH PIERRE GENECAND TWO EQUESTRIAN SPORTS AND ONE PASSION: ORGANIZATION.

After reviving the Concours Hippique International de Genève and making it the most popular indoor event on the international circuit, Geneva-born Pierre Genecand took over the organization of the Hublot Polo Gold Cup in Gstaad 20 years ago and turned it into a jewel. The former boss of Gesrep, Switzerland's oldest insurance brokerage firm, now divides his time between Uruguay, where he lives, Argentina, where his polo farm is located, and Switzerland, between Gstaad and Geneva. An inveterate hard worker, he can be summed up in three words: rigor, humor, and loyalty. WHAT IS YOUR HISTORY WITH HORSES, AND HOW DID YOU DISCOVER THEM? DID YOU GROW UP IN A RIDING FAMILY?

No one in my family was a rider. I started riding at the age of 9 and competed modestly at the national level in show-jumping competitions for 40 years. But there's no need to dwell on my career as a showjumper.

THERE WAS A TIME, NOT SO LONG AGO, WHEN YOU APPEARED IN VIRTUALLY EVERY CSI: WHY THIS PASSION FOR THIS DISCIPLINE? I chaired the CHI in Geneva for 18 years and was a member of the World Cup committee. My travels enabled me to bring innovative ideas to Geneva, reinforcing the importance and reputation of this event, which has become a benchmark in the world of show jumping.

YOU RELAUNCHED THE CHI DE GENÈVE IN THE 1990S: WHY AND HOW DID THAT HAPPEN?

In 1987, the CHI de Genève, which was then held at Les Vernets on the site of an ice rink, lost its status as a World Cup stage because the facilities did not meet the criteria required to host such a competition. Yves G. Piaget, President at the

time, wanted to step down. I submitted my candidacy and introduced a new project in the vast spaces of Palexpo-Genève. I insisted that our competition should be annual rather than biennial.

THEN YOU SWITCHED TO POLO. HOW DID YOU DISCOVER THIS SPORT?

After giving up show jumping, I discovered polo on a trip to Argentina in 2000 and immediately fell in love with the sport.

YOU'VE PLAYED IN TOURNAMENTS, ONCE AT PALERMO, I THINK. WHAT IS YOUR BEST MEMORY, YOUR GREATEST SUCCESS? I was lucky enough to play in a small tournament where the final was held in Palermo. Having qualified for that final, I was able to play on Cancha 2. As for the rest, being a pure amateur, I play at a very average level and, as we say in Switzerland, 'badly but regularly.' Nevertheless, despite my age, I still participate in practice games and small tournaments in Argentina.

YOU'VE MET SOME OF THE GREATEST SHOW-JUMPING RIDERS AND POLO PLAYERS: WHO HAS MADE THE BIGGEST IMPRESSION ON YOU, IN TERMS OF PERSONALITY, IN EACH OF THE TWO DISCIPLINES?

In show jumping, I consider the Pessoa family—father and son, Nelson and Rodrigo—to be the best riders. Beyond their talent, they possess a class and education that many jumping riders unfortunately lack, despite their equestrian excellence. In polo, I think Poroto Cambiaso has the most style and efficiency, despite his very young age. What's more, he has been fortunate to receive a strict upbringing, which makes him appreciated by everyone, especially sponsors. YOUR LOVE OF POLO LED YOU TO ESTAB-LISH A POLO HORSE STUD IN ARGENTINA. THE ESTANCIA EL MIRASOL, CAN YOU TELL US A LITTLE MORE ABOUT THIS STUD FARM? In 2001, we built a modest campo in the province of Entre Ríos, with two polo fields and a good hundred horses in the meadows. Every year, we breed between ten and fourteen foals. We breed with our own two in-house stallions. One of our best mares was called In Class, with whom I participated in several seasons of tournaments in Switzerland, France, and Argentina. Unfortunately, we never managed to breed her. Two years ago, I entrusted the management of the campo to Hector Salvo, the father of Lia, whom everyone knows. He is particularly responsible for our breeding program and runs it efficiently.

YOU NOW HAVE URUGUAYAN NATIONALITY, WHICH IS NO COINCIDENCE, SINCE ONE OF YOUR ACTIVITIES IS AGRICULTURE IN THAT COUNTRY. CAN YOU TELL US A BIT ABOUT KIELDER AGRO GROUP?

I don't have Uruguayan nationality; I have a residence permit. Kielder Agro Group is a family company active in agriculture and the production of specialty foods (olive oil and coffee) in South America, the USA, and Africa.

AND FINALLY, WHILE YOU HAVE ENTRUSTED THE ORGANIZATION OF THE CHI IN GENEVA TO SOPHIE MOTTU, YOU HAVE TAKEN OVER THE ORGANIZATION OF THE HUBLOT POLO GOLD CUP IN GSTAAD. WHY THIS ENTHUSI-ASM FOR EVENT ORGANIZATION?

Sophie Mottu-Morel was my assistant when I was President of the CHI de Genève. It was natural for her to take over, and I admire the work she does and the development of the event. Unlike many other show-jumping organizers, she has managed to retain a certain tradition and class. The size of the track and the spirit that reigns at CHI Genève have won over riders who prefer not to participate in other events taking place on the same weekend, even if they offer better prize money. Geneva allows horses and riders to compete without being forced to jump the same obstacles in identical sandboxes every weekend, motivated solely by prize money.

I've always had a passion for organizing events, whether sporting or commercial. With my experience as the organizer of the CHI-W in Geneva for several years, taking over Gstaad Polo was an easy decision, especially as I also live in this charming village in German-speaking Switzerland.

I have been organizing Gstaad for 20 years now, and we've had HUBLOT as our main sponsor for 18 years. All our other very loyal partners have also become friends. We start this event from scratch each year, as we play in the middle of the runway at Gstaad airport. We need to build the VIP tents (1,350 VIP meals served in 2024), the stables (120 boxes), the exhibitors' village, and the Kinder Paradies (children's paradise/play area). The goal is to organize an event at a level that our sponsors deserve.

WHAT DOES THE 2025 EDITION OF THIS MAJOR TOURNAMENT IN SWITZERLAND AND EUROPE HAVE IN STORE FOR US?

We already know the four team managers for the 2025 edition, which will take place from August 21 to 24. They are Switzerland's Fabio Meier and Markus Graff, Germany's Juergen Schroeder, a finalist in 2023, and Argentina's Juan Pepa, who won the Silver and Gold Cups in Deauville and the French Open in Chantilly in 2017. All in all, it promises to be a highly competitive event.



A PALACE WITH AN EQUESTRIAN SOUL


















Educated at the prestigious EHL Hospitality Business School of Lausanne, Abdeslam Bennani Smires is a well-known rider on the international show jumping circuit. He represented Morocco at the World Equestrian Games in Caen, and he was favored to represent his country at the Olympic Games in Tokyo. Yet, it was the trying time of Covid. His priority was to take care of his "baby", the hotel he founded some twenty years ago with his sister, the Selman, and to look after its two hundred unemployed staff.

Although Abdeslam is an accomplished show jumper, he and his family are equally passionate about Arabian thoroughbreds. It's a passion he wanted to incorporate into the vision of his palace: the stud farm and the hotel are uniquely one and the same. Both were designed by the famous French architect and decorator Jacques Garcia: "I wanted him to create the exterior and interior architecture of the Selman because Garcia has an orientalist culture. However, when I made up my mind, I learned that La Mamounia had just asked him to do their renovations, and I thought he wouldn't agree to design two hotels in the same city at the same time. Nevertheless, I picked up the phone, and his assistant immediately made an appointment for me. It was a great meeting, and Jacques Garcia accepted the challenge immediately, which was essentially to do something completely different from La Mamounia. From that first meeting, he picked up his pencil and offered me his first



sketches. He was already full of ideas, inspired by the Moorish period and the first Arab invasions in the middle of the 7th century, which left us with some of the most beautiful monuments in Morocco".

"Sublime" is a rather weak word to describe the result. As soon as you enter, you feel at home, captivated by the instantly recognizable Garcia signature and enchanted by the subtle scent of oriental perfume.

Nothing is missing to enjoy carefree days in the most chic and sophisticated luxury: Chenot Spa, gastronomy by Jean-François Piège, swimming pools (one of which is an infinity), lush gardens, endless kindness of the staff, spacious rooms and suites, private villas, signature experiences, and much more.

We come to Selman for this impeccable luxury, but it's the horses that set this place apart from other palaces. From the moment you sit down for breakfast, you'll be surrounded by horses in green paddocks. We're just a few steps away from the stables, designed by Jacques Garcia, which is also a 5-star hotel for horses. The guests, of course, are Arabian thoroughbreds, but also the hauteécole horses of Catherine, the hotel's Belgian trainer, who offers Selman guests equestrian experiences (dressage, free riding) and shows during brunch. The thoroughbred Arabian horses are privately bred by the Abdeslam family. Many of these horses have won prestigious beauty prizes. The Bennani Smires family breeding farm, known as Selman Arabians, has been regularly voted the best Arabian thoroughbred breeding farm in the Kingdom of Morocco since 2014.

Some of these horses are showcased at Moroccan dinners in a local setting during a magnificent parade that concludes the evening. It's also possible to dine tête-à-tête in these incredible stables, one of the hotel's singular signature experiences. In short, it's the perfect way to relax, and you must force yourself to have the desire and courage to leave this piece of paradise to visit, for example, the Marrakech medina, just ten minutes away, with its famous souk and the equally famous Jemaa El Fna square.


